OVE IN INTEREST OF ALASKA LAND OFFICIALS.

ving Expenses Are So High That Present Pay Is Totally Inadequate-Officer on Subject.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7.—It is a fact that has long been recognized that the daries allowed certain Government ofials in Alaska are totally inadequate afford them a comfortable means of pport, and efforts have repeatedly been ade in the interest of an increase. At e same time a question arises which said have some influence upon this atter. There are far too many Govern-ent officers of certain classes now in Al-ka, but owing to Senatorial patronage sich those offices afford, it is almost an essibility to reduce these forces to r proper number. Just now an effort boling reade to have the salaries of fisters and Receivers in the Alaskan and Offices in creased, and in explana-m of the need of such an increase, the ollowing letter from a Governmen officer a Alaska, will bring out the necessity of

uch a change:
"In regard to salaries and fees allowed and officers in Alaska being totally indequate on account of the increased est of Bring up here, permit me to call attention to some of the requisitions sent to the frequent of the salaries. to the Interior Department by Receivers scaled in the interior, estimating 40 cords of wood at 230 per cord, for office use, per ennum, and eight to ten cases of coal di at \$13 50 per case. This will enable to give some estimate of the excessive expense of keeping a family in Al-neka. While it is not so bad at Sitka and in Southeastern Alaska, still \$1500 will of pay the current expenses of an aver-

age family anywhere up here.
"I further call attention to the fact that for all the territories of the West, Registers and Receivers were allowed 2500 and fees, up to 182, at a time the ees and commissions had so increased hat the galaries could be reduced. It would seem a simple matter of justice hat the same treatment should be exended to Alaska, until such time as the ncome from fees and commissions would dmit of reduction. "Up to the present time they are no

surveyed iands in Alzaka, and it is questionable, owing to so much waste land, whether it will ever warrant or justify the general Government in extending the general law for surveying all lands. is not an agricultural or grazing country; it is valuable chiefly for its minerals and fishing. As miners, as a rule, do not seek to patent land, there has been comparatively little revenue in the way of less and commissions, and cannot be for many years to come. very recently no competent man could be found to fill the offices in the interior, for the reasons shown above. To relieve these conditions, it is simply proposed to amend the act extending the homestead laws to Alaska, by increasing the salaries of Registers and Receivers from \$1500 to \$2500 per annum.

"In answer to the objection that may

be raised that this would increase the exense of conducting the Government busat the proposed salary men more efficient than those obtainable at \$1500 could be obtained, and that the number of officers could be reduced, so that there would be but one or two Land Offices in all Alaska, which it is believed could more than keep mp with all the work it is possible for the Surveyor-General to prepare during the pear. "Therefore, looking at it from an economical and Governmental standpoint, is to increase the compensation and effi-ciency of the service and limit the number of offices, thereby saving not only sal-aries, but the exhorbitant contingent ex-penses for keeping up a greater number

However, as set forth above, a difficult matter to have the offices outside of Sitka abolished, as the Sena-tors who have the filling of such places will never consent wifully to their abolsaid never consent wilding to their adol-ishment, even though it be in the interest of a better or more economical service.
