Up to the present time nearly every one of the plants has had a general manager at a selary rang-ing at from \$15,000 to \$25,000 a year. These offices are to be wiped out and each smelter is to have a superintendent, who is to report to the Denver headquarters, in charge of ex-Governor Grant.
