R. & N., a short distance west of the Fairview depot. It is proposed to start a \$10,000 grist mill which will be operated by steam. It has been found that the water power on the Smith estate is not sufficient to operate the mill. This is the report of A. G. Sachrodt, the mill expert who made the examination. The promotors of the mill enterprise will meet with the people of the Fairview neigneerhood Tuesday afternoon and make an offer, which if accepted will mean that the mill will be built and put in operation at once. Hundreds of cars of flour and feed are received yearly at Fairview for shipment to Gresham Pleasant Home and other points in East ern Multnomah, some distance from the railway, and it is considered certain a mill at Fairview could readily dispose of all its output.
