ALASKA LAND DECISION

COMMISSIONER'S BULING IN AMAK-NAK ISLAND CASE.

Government Needed Territory, So Withdrew It From Entry-Only One Legal Complaint.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—A great deal of interest centered in the recent de-cision of the Commissioner of the Gen-eral Land Office, with regard to Amaknak Island, in Dutch Harbor, Alaska. The de-cision, heretofore briefly reviewed, is sub-

stantially as follows: On September 1, 1990, all lands at Dutch darbor, Alaska, were withdrawn from entry or location, except where surveys had been approved, and notice given to submit proof. The department ordered an investigation to determine what land was valuable for a permanent reservation for a permanent reservation.

for a naval coaling station, in accordance with the request of the Secretary of the Navy, made on October 5, 1990.

A very full report of the facts in the case has been submitted by Special Agent Edward W. Dixon, who found but one valid claim on Amaknak Island, that of the North American Commercial Com-pany, embracing 90 acres. The other claims were not such as would give the cleimants any rights as against the Government, nor were they such as would authorize an entry for trade or manufacture or other industry, there being no actual occupancy by the respective claim-

The only available location for a coaltng station surveyed by Mr. Dixon is im-mediately north of the North American Commercial Company's land, comprising 100 acres, which is now embraced in what is known as the Buddock claim, and is the same tract of land set aside by exscutive order of January 13, 1889, for light-house purposes. The necessity for taking this reservation for lighthouse purposes. If no other site is available for a coaling wintion, is a matter that was not con-sidered, nor is it a question within the province of the General Land Office to discuss. Commissioner Hermann is of the opinion that the entire island, with the exception of the land embraced in the claim of the North American Commercial Company, should be permanently reserved and placed under the control of the military and saval authorities for the purpose of protecting the harbor. He calls especial attention to that portion of Spedat Agent Dixon's report stating that ships after discharging their cargoes at Dutch Harbor have then been in the cus-tom of going to the spit, which is a natoral breakwater, for ballast, which practice, if continued, will cause its destruc-tion and seriously menace the harbor. Relative to Agent Dixon's recommenda-

tion that the lake embraced within the claim of the Commercial Company, he is of the opinion that this company has a vested right to all area included within their survey, and that no change can be made. The land in question has been oc-cupied by this company since 1890. The original survey contained 157 acres, but was amended and reduced later. Application to purchase was made last April, and final proof subsequently submitted, but action was temporarily suspended on

The proof submitted clearly establishes the right of the company to purchase the land embraced within its present claim, and unless otherwise ordered by the De-partment, the local officers will be in-

partment, the local officers will be instructed to accept payment and allow
final entry. The price to be paid will be
about \$1.50 per acre.

If it should be necessary to occupy any
portion of the land claimed by the company, or to utilize the water of the lake
embraced within the tract, for public purposes, it could be done in accordance with
the law. If all of Anaknak Island is permanently withdrawn from entry, or loscated for public purposes, the Government could then take such steps as it
thought best in the interest of protecting
the harbor, and establishing and maintaining a coaling station for the benefit
of our warships. It is not thought, from

the Government will conflict with those
