House Committee on Rivers and Harbors.

JUNE THE TIME FOR THE TRIP

All the important rivers and harbors of the West are to be inspected—House Military Committee Plans Like Journey.

WASHINGTON, March 1.—The river and harbor committee of the House today informally decided on a junket to the Pacific Coast and Japan with a view to inspecting the more important rivers and harbors of the West. It is proposed to first stop at Galveston, then proceed to Southern California, and up the entire Pacific Coast.

The delegation hopes that its invitation may be supplemented by others from Chambers of Commerce and similar bodies of Portland and other Oregon cities.

PORT OF PORTLAND BILL FILED BY THE GOVERNOR.

Also Measure to Reconstruct the County Court of Multnomah and Four Others. SALEM, Or., March 1.—Governor Geer today filed the following bills without his signature, thus permitting them to become laws:

Senate bill 171—The Port of Portland bill. House bill 133—To reconstruct the County Court of Multnomah County.

Senate bill 172—To annex the panhandle of Union county to Baker County. Senate bill 173—The orphan's home bill, appropriating \$50 per capita for inmates.

Senate bill 174—Enacting the Torrens system of public land registration. Senate bill 175—The primary election bill.
