The volume of dealings in United States steel stocks was contemplated with de-light by the commission brokers as an active speculation in a stock comprising a capital of 8,500,000 shares. The day's business in the common stock amounted to 155,000 shares, and in the preferred to to 153,000 shares, and in the preferred to 120,000 shares, or for both 17 per cunt of the total transactions. The common stock was lifted at one time 1% to 46, and the preferred 1% to 56. 


