

# The Money Market.

The gains by the banks from the sub-Treasury, owing to the high level of pen-sion payments and the buying of bonds by the Secretary of the Treasury, afforded unquestioned relief to the money market. The rise in Chicago exchange to loe premium also reflects the turning point in the interior currency movement in favor of New York. But the significant fact of New York. But the significant fact in the day's money situation was the quick response of the sterling exchange market to the easier money conditions here, giving grounds for the conjecture that any increase in the available supply of funds in New York will go to London for the purpose of the coming issue of compois It is important to remember that this at is important to remember that this government loan, which is estimated at \$250,000,000 as a minimum, is in excess of any loan placed since the French indem-nity to Germany. The London money market is at present not only heavily in-debted to the Bank of England, but the amount of French and American capital

amount of French and American capital at interest in London is of unprecedented volume. London's solicitude over the foreign exchange is thus easily explicable. The constant growth of the trade balance indicates little increase of this country's capital resources for investment. But it is obvious that the placing of the invest-ment is purely a question of relative in-terest rates. The extraordinary financial operations in progress in New York were again reflected today in the clearing-house exchanges, which reached the astonishing aggregate of \$445,241,223 com-pared with the previous record of daily clearings of \$437,852,880 on one day of last week. 
