It Will Be Observed Formally and Informally at St. Mark's Church.

This being the feast of St. Mark, there will be a celebration of the holy communion in St. Mark's Church, corner of Nineteenth and Quimby streets, at 10:30 A. M. Evensong will be sung in the church at 7:30 P. M., when the Rev. William Seymour Short, rector of Grace Church, Astoria, will preach. After the evening service there will be a social gathering of the members and friends of the parish in the guildroom, when an announcement of great importance—one that will give great pleasure to the members of the parish—will be made. It is particularly desired that all who are interested in St. Mark's will make it a point to be present.

The women of the guild will provide refreshments, and the Norwegian double quartet has kindly promised to sing some of its beautiful folk-songs. Edna Thielborn, the well-known musician, has also consented to play on this occasion. Songs will also be sung by Mrs. McGuire, a singer recently from California. Miss Minnie M. Williamson, the organist of the church, will be the accompanist, and will also render several musical numbers on the piano. Probably the most interesting feature of the evening will be a recitation by a prominent member of the parish, an old-time song-and-dance man. A cordial invitation is extended to all friends of St. Mark's to be present at the services and at the meeting in the evening.

DURPHY'S CASE ARGUED.

Municipal Judge Cameron Takes It Under Adjudication.

The case of Bradley F. Durphy, charged with polygamy, occupied Judge Cameron's time a good portion of yesterday afternoon, but no evidence was offered, nor was the complaining witness present. The attorneys on both sides had prepared themselves with stacks of law books, and the whole time was taken up in argument. The defense admitted all the testimony previously introduced by the state, but argues that no crime had been committed by Durphy, as he had a legal right to marry Miss Margaret Ryan in Illinois, not having heard of his Massachusetts wife for a period of five years. The Deputy Prosecuting Attorney argued that Durphy's first wife did not desert him, and that his case did not legally come under the protection of Illinois laws. Judge Cameron, on adjourning court late in the afternoon, took the case under advisement. The evidence had been taken by a stenographer and extended into type-written sheets, and the Judge was given charge of this, with a number of books to whose pages both sides referred. He did not state when he would decide as to holding Durphy to a higher court, and an examination of the voluminous authorities will probably take some time.

Grand Avenue and East Burnside.

The only way by which the improvement of East Burnside street and Grand Avenue can now be carried forward is for owners of the property to agree to have the work done, and pay for it. Mayor Rowe and City Engineer Chase are both of the opinion that this is the only way these improvements can be made under the recent decision of Judge Bellinger. If all the property owners agree to go ahead, bids may be asked by the City Auditor, but the money must be paid before contracts can be let. The petitions call for the improvement of East Burnside street between the bridge approach and East Fourteenth street, and of Grand Avenue between Belmont and East Burnside streets.
