RESULT WAS DIFFERENT.

Seattle Won the Second Game From Tacoma—Score 6 to 1.

TACOMA, Wash., May 2.—It was different today, and the fans did not approve of the change. Tacoma could not connect with the delivery of the elongated ball, and the support that he got was enough to keep the locals down to a showing of but one man, who made the circuit in safety. Seattle opened on Thielman and his home for a total of 13 hits, sufficiently enough to set six runs. The work of Knapton McCarthy at short was the feature of the game, his desperate chances winning repeatedly. Seattle had no trouble on the bases, for Menefee who is catching for Tacoma during Zeafrow's illness, could not get the ball down, and the second baseman was piffled repeatedly. A double steal—second and third—was worked by Seattle in the fourth inning without any attempt to head off the base-runners. A feature of the game was the fact that neither of the pitchers gave a base on balls, and the sharp fielding by both teams was reassuring. Seattle appeared today in much better form than yesterday. The Tacoma team is still crippled. Zeafrow's being out with a broken thumb, and St. Vrain sick. Thielman, who pitched today, is not in condition. The score follows:
