PRESIDENT MISSED MUCH

PORTLAND WAS PREPARED TO DO HIM GREAT HONOR.

Executive Committee Will Decide What Disposition Will Be Made of the Reception Fund.

The rosy dream of a monster reception in honor of President McKinley, the vision of a military parade headed by the Third Regiment of Oregon National Guard, the gallant members of the Grand Army of the Republic, civic organizations, and the "human flag" as star features, the historic ceremony of the breaking of ground for the Lewis and Clark Centennial, and the patriotic spectacle of thousands of bright-faced school children waving flags in graceful salute to the Chief Executive of the land, the sight of thousands of visitors pushing

and shoving in the crowded throng of people to grasp the hand of the distinguished guest at the public reception—all have vanished with the news that the President's Northwest trip has been abandoned. That the announcement was received with regret was manifested by the many expressions heard about town yesterday when Mayor Rowe received a telegram from San Francisco to that effect, that the President would not come North.

The telegram received by Mayor Rowe was from John H. Hall and the members of the local committee in San Francisco, who had a conference with the President, and was as follows:

"Owing to the serious illness of Mrs. McKinley, the President has abandoned his trip to Oregon, and will return direct to Washington. He desires that his regrets be expressed."

Perhaps the most disappointed of Portland's residents were the schoolchildren. No others had looked forward with greater eagerness to the President's visit, and for no others had the general committee made greater preparations.

Mayor Rowe was interviewed yesterday afternoon on the question of the disposition of the funds the committee has raised for the entertainment of the Presidential party, and as to whether the body will remain organized to act as a reception committee for the Ohio
