

TO HELP CHAMBERLAIN

CHANGE IN OFFICERS OF DEMOCRATIC STATE COMMITTEE.

Sam White, of Baker City, Succeeds R. S. Sheridan as Chairman-Secretary Burke Also Resigns.

At a special meeting of the Democratic state central committee, held at the Imperial Hotel yesterday afternoon, Chairman R. S. Sheridan, of Baker City, presented his resignation, which was accepted, and Samuel White, of Baker City, prosecuting attorney in the Eighth district, was immediately chosen to fill the vacancy.

It is frankly avowed that Mr. White is not a political or personal enemy of Hon. George E. Chamberlain. The resignation of Secretary W. E. was also presented and accepted. It is the chairman's duty to appoint the secretary.

Nineteen of the 22 counties in the state were represented at the meeting, and the session was brief. Chairman Sheridan presided and he appointed H. L. Heath, of Multnomah, temporary secretary. There were no speeches, and the business before the committee was transacted with commendable promptness. Chairman Sheridan's reason for resigning was that he was about to leave the state and engage in newspaper work at Boise, Idaho. This was deemed a conclusive reason why his official relations with the Oregon committee should terminate. Burke's reason for quitting was not given, but the inference was allowed to prevail that his time was too fully occupied with his private business that he could not perform the duty of secretary; that he had served through the campaign when there was hot work to do, and that he wished to relinquish the honors and the duties of the position. No candidate appeared in opposition to Mr. White, and he was unanimously chosen as the head of the Democratic state organization.

All this appears on the surface to be very commonplace and formal, but those who look under the surface for the real import of political facts assume a different view and by way of explaining their attitude say, simply, "Chamberlain." For significance of utterance, Poe's raven wasn't "in it" for a moment. Chamberlain, George E. Chamberlain—that name sheds light on every Democratic act these days. Of course, it cannot be said that Sheridan was Chamberlain's foe, or that he was forced out of the committee for both statements would be untrue and unnecessary. But the vacancy, having occurred in the regular course of human affairs, the astute and altogether reasonable thing to do was to choose a new man who could be a friend of Chamberlain, a particular friend, if you please.

White is a friend of Mr. Chamberlain. Both he and Mr. Chamberlain admit this, though neither will admit that this friendship is as close as to militate against any other candidate for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination. They even do not talk of Chamberlain as a candidate. It isn't necessary.

When a reporter bluntly asked Mr. White last night if he was in favor of the nomination of George E. Chamberlain for Governor, he evaded the point. "I am not committed to Mr. Chamberlain, or anyone else," said he. "I am in favor of a man who can bring us the greatest strength. I believe the Democratic party of Oregon is in better shape than ever before, and that a businesslike campaign with a good ticket will give us victory at the next state election. I mean to work hard for success. I shall organize the party thoroughly through the organization, get the best men I can into the posts of honor and responsibility, and go forward confidently for a clean and successful campaign. We have begun in time to do this."

Mr. Chamberlain said he was not present at the meeting of the committee, and had only heard indirectly of the result, which he regarded as quite without significance. He didn't rave and threaten to kill anybody when his own name was mentioned in connection with the gubernatorial candidacy. Mr. Chamberlain is a very mild-mannered man.

Chairman White was surprised that he should be selected for the official belittler of the party. He had heard nothing of it, he said, until he arrived from Baker City yesterday morning on his way to Salem on business before the Supreme Court. He was not even a member of the State Central Committee, J. H. Robinson being Baker County's representative. Several members of the committee met Mr. White at the train and implored him to permit himself to be elected chairman. He modestly hesitated until assured that he should, if he would, be chosen unanimously for the position. Then he yielded. The election followed in due course. There was a little desultory discussion as to ways and means, but no definite action was taken as to any of those particulars, the general sentiment being in favor of waiting for the chairman to appoint a secretary and look the field over and make suggestions.

It will be some time before the new secretary will be appointed. Chairman White says he will not be in a hurry about it. He will take his time and look through every county in the state. "My purpose is not merely to get a competent clerk," he said, "but to get a man who will bring strength to the party organization also. Of course, we have many such men, but I want to consider the matter maturely and select the man who, in view of all circumstances, will be best for the place and can give us the service and the influence required."

Chairman White was born in Griffin, Ga., September 15, 1850. He was educated and admitted to the bar in his native state. In 1886 he came to Oregon, and for two years practiced law in Grant's Past. Then he removed to Baker City, where his home has since been. In 1896 he made an unsuccessful canvass for the District Attorneyship. In 1898 and 1899 he was elected. He has always been a straight Democrat—not Populist, not gold Democrat. His wife is the daughter of Albert Brown, who was State Treasurer when Grover was Governor.

FINE OREGON APRICOTS.

Smead Farm at Blalocks Shipping Fruit to Portland.

Oregon apricots are being sold on the streets at two cents for five cents, or 15 cents a box, and they seem to go like hot cakes. The fruit, though no larger than English walnuts, is of very good flavor. It was raised by the Smead Fruit Farm Association, at Blalocks, on the bank of the Columbia River in Gilliam County. Mr. Smead, who was in the city yesterday, said the apricots were small because they had not been thinned out properly on the trees, growing close together on the branches like great bunches of grapes.

There are 1300 of these trees on the place. Mr. Smead said, and they have borne full crops for the past four years, or ever since they were four years old. He is entirely satisfied with the demand for them in Portland, though the price is just high enough to prevent the fruit being evaporated on the farm. "Dried apricots," he said, "readily bring 30 cents a pound, and the net receipts for Portland shipments just about equal this, so we save ourselves the trouble of drying."

In speaking of general results on the Blalock fruit farm, Mr. Smead said: "We now have 20,000 fruit trees in fine condition, and the farm is beginning to return a fair interest on the large amount of money expended in bringing the trees to their present state of perfection. The next fruit to be shipped to Portland will be peaches, then plums, and then apples will be ripe enough to send down. We use an expensive apparatus to pump the water out of the river for irrigation. It is an elongated wheel of

wood and iron, which utilizes the power of the current. The capacity of the pump is 50,000 gallons per hour, raised to an average height of 40 feet. He has over 2 1/2 miles of flumes, and from these, lateral ditches are run, leading the water past the rows of trees. We have an abundance of water during the irrigating season.
