

EVANS DESERVES PRAISE

SOME, HOWEVER, CENSURE HIM FOR BEING A JUST OFFICIAL.

By Careful Administration the Amount for Pensions Was \$5,000,000 Less Than Appropriation.

WASHINGTON, July 18.—The enemies of Pension Commissioner Evans are setting every available opportunity of condemning his administration; and have lately made a great deal of noise over the fact that during the past fiscal year the Pension Office did not expend the full appropriation for pensions, but turned back into the treasury a surplus of \$5,000,000.

That is not a business-like or common-sense view of the situation. The laws governing pensions prescribe the amounts that shall be allowed for different disabilities. It is the mere duty of the Pension Office to make its allowances in strict accordance with the law. It is not within the option of the bureau to allow large or small pensions at will. The Pension Office made an estimate of the amount that would be needed for paying pensions. Then, as claims were presented, each was examined, and if necessary was granted, and the unworthy were disallowed. Pure justice guided the action of the bureau, and by close discrimination the amount of \$5,000,000 was not exceeded.
