PHIARIS AT OUTS WITH FEDERAL PARTY AT MANILA.

Native Filipinos Will Not Again Accept Priests Belonging to the Orders.

A merry war is on at Manila between the Federal party and the Spanish friars, who want to be restored to their ancient rights in the parishes.

The sentiment against the friars is still alive as attested by the hostile reception which was recently given to the order of the archbishop of Manila.

If the ban is given them, they will also leave the city, and will be permitted to visit the islands and the provinces.

It would be far better to do away with the whole Federal party, as they are not of the present but of the past.
