

TRAINING UNION MEN

STEEL TRUST OFFICIALS MAKING USE OF RAW MATERIAL.

No Change in the Situation at Pittsburg—Canal Dover Strikers Enjoyed From Picketing.

PITTSBURG, Aug. 29.—Officials of the United States Steel Corporation... The Amalgamated Association stated today that they are receiving many applications from former employees for work.

One of the steel officials said today that a general mistake was being made in regarding the strikers as a unit... It is confidently asserted that in a few more months it will be possible to produce many new men and plenty to man all the plants that are now idle.

Reports from all the mills of the corporation show that steady gains are being made in the force of non-striker men... The men who have returned to work are being trained by the company officials.

Pickets about the Lindsay-McCuehoo plant today were well equipped with a new man today who was bound for the mills... The strike was held up for a few days.

Regarding the rumor that the steelworkers' strike would affect the opening of the plant... The plant is now being worked by the company officials.

There was little of interest about headquarters of the Amalgamated Association today... The cause of the absence of Assistant Secretary Davis is being investigated.

Reports tonight from outside points indicate no change whatever in the strike situation... Much interest is being taken in the report from Chicago which says he is engaged with ex-President Davis in organizing a new Amalgamated lodge in South Chicago.

Secretary Williams received a check from the first glassworkers today for \$300, besides several other large donations... The members of John F. Ward and Pride of Newcastle lodges of the Amalgamated Association, composed of the striking ironworkers, tonight held a secret session.

After next Monday the Amalgamated Association will begin the payment of strike benefits to each as are still out of employment... The rate is \$4 a week.

PULLMAN TURNED OVER

SERIOUS ACCIDENT TO A RIO GRANDE TRAIN.

Mother Baptiste, of Denver, Mother Superior of Colorado, Was Killed and Three Others Were Injured.

DURANGO, Colo., Aug. 29.—By the turning over of the Pullman on the west bound Rio Grande passenger train at 11:35 this morning, Mother Baptiste, of Denver, mother superior of Colorado, was killed, and Sister Mary Nora and Harley McCoy, also of Denver, and Pullman Conductor Whan were injured.

The accident occurred at Lobato side track about 100 yards from the high bridge, five miles east of Chama. Railroad men and passengers alike are unable to explain why the car turned over as the train was slower than usual, the track in good condition and there was no breakage before the accident.

Mother Baptiste was sitting on the left side and the car turned to the right. When the elections were over the committee on time and place of next meeting reported... San Francisco was the only bidder and carried off the honor without a struggle.

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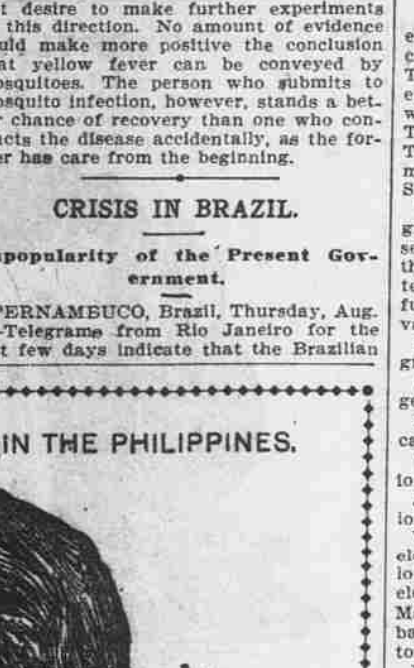
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RETURNING TO HIS POST IN THE PHILIPPINES.
