

REEVE RICKMERS IN PORT

GERMAN SHIP MAKES A MODERATE PASSAGE ACROSS THE PACIFIC. September Ships Nearly All In-British Ship Cromaryshire Burned at Sea—Holiday Observed.

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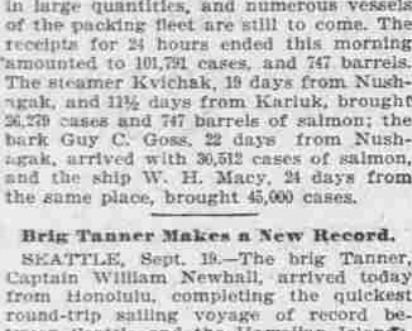
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CZAR AT SHAM FIGHT

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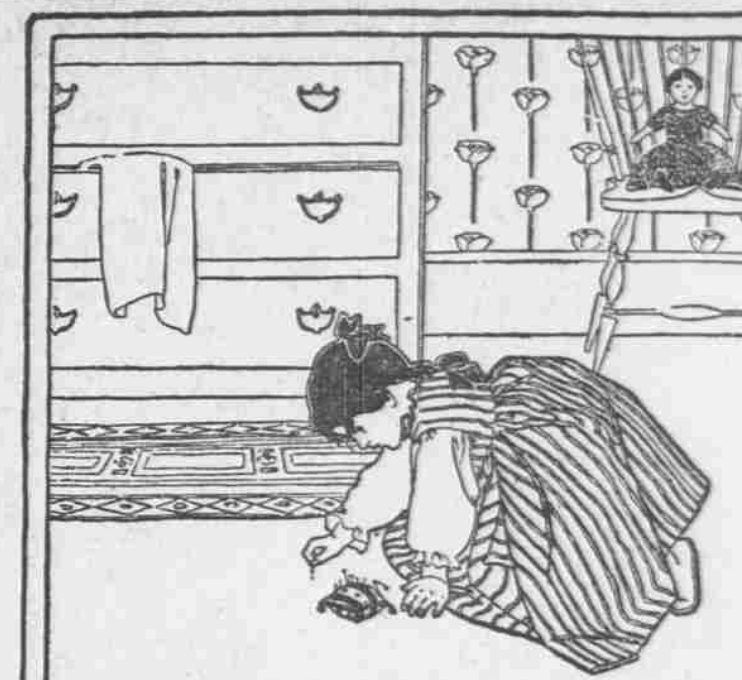
