

DOOMED TO THE GALLOWS

JAMES G. GREEN WILL SURELY BE HANGED.

Governor Rogers Declares Emphatically That He Will Not Stay the Process of Justice.

OLYMPIA, Wash., Oct. 7.—James G. Green, who is under sentence of death for the murder of E. C. Benjamin, in Skamania County, last March, has been granted a reprieve by Governor Rogers.

In the past it has been the custom, where the trial judge and prosecuting attorney asked for a commutation, for the Governor to grant it, but in the case of Green the Governor said today that even if the Judge who tried Green and the attorney who prosecuted him were to join in a petition for clemency, it would not be granted.
