

GOOD NAMES PUT IN

Republicans Submitted to
County Commissioners.

ELECTION JUDGES AND CLERKS

Carefully Prepared List of Represent-
ative Citizens Qualified to Insure
a Fair Primary and an Hon-
est Election.

A list of names of Republicans suitable
for the positions of Judges and Clerks of
Election was filed with the County Com-
missioners yesterday by W. B. Ayer. The list com-
prises the names of men well known in
business and professional life, and their
appointment will be urged upon the County
Court by persons interested in a fair
primary and election.

Asked later regarding the list, Mr. Ayer
said that, in connection with other busi-
ness men, he had been for some time at
work securing names to present to the
County Court, for it to act upon in mak-
ing selections for judges and clerks, who
will officiate at the primaries to be held
in April and the election in June; that
those engaged in this work had felt the
importance of having in these offices
men who were above reproach, whose ad-
ministration should be strictly in ac-
cordance with the letter and spirit of the
law, and who would not use their posi-
tions to serve the ends of any political
party or faction; that in the preparation
of the list two objects were constantly
kept in view: First, the character and
integrity of the men selected; secondly,
loyalty to Republican principles. The list
presented to the court, he said, came as
near to filling these requirements as it
was possible to do.

Asked when the Republican county and
city committee would submit names for
judges and clerks, Dr. O. P. S. Plummer,
chairman, said the list was already in the
hands of the County Commissioners.
"There is plenty of material," said Chair-
man Plummer. "Everybody seems to be
willing to serve. The Commissioners will
have no trouble at all in securing enough
men to fill the places on the Republican
side."
