

PRINCE HENRY'S MISSION

AFTER HIS AMERICAN VISIT, HE WILL ATTEND CORONATION.

Special Steamer Will Be Placed at His Disposal for His Trip to New York.

BERLIN, Jan. 14.—It has been announced that Prince Henry, of Prussia, on his return from the United States, will be deputed to represent Emperor William at the coronation of King Edward.

An arrangement has been made between the German Admiralty and the North German Lloyd Steamship Company, by which the Imperial yacht Hohenzollern, when she arrives at Hoboken, will be freshly painted in order to remove all traces of her long voyage, and that she may present her handsome appearance for the festivities.

German papers print long cablegrams from New York dwelling on the interest developed by Prince Henry's projected visit, describing the tentative plans for his entertainment and giving the comment of the New York press on the matter.

Plans for the Prince's Reception. WASHINGTON, Jan. 14.—Cable advices received at the German Embassy here indicate that Prince Henry will arrive off New York about February 14. While Dr. von Holleben, the German ambassador, has not yet been advised fully as to the details of Prince Henry's visit, it is the opinion of the embassy officials that the stay will not extend over a fortnight, and the voyage of the Hohenzollern will be to meet by the reception fleet of naval vessels and steamers, which will escort the Hohenzollern into New York harbor.

It is probable that when the Hohenzollern takes Prince Henry to New York, he will be escorted down to Sandy Hook by the Olympia or the San Francisco. Both of these fine ships have been almost completely reconstructed since they were captured by the British in 1812.

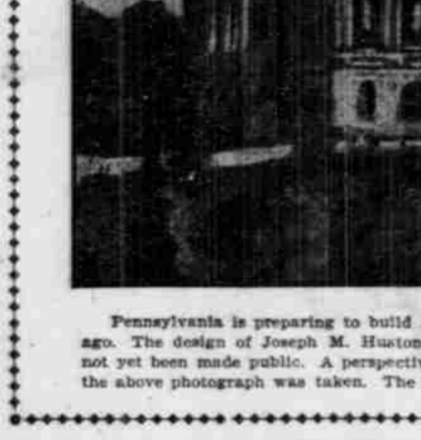
