

NAVIGATION SUSPENDED

SLAKE AND MIDDLE COLUMBIA STEAMERS STOPPED BY ICE.

French Bark Henriette and Steamer Regulator Labeled—French Barks Make Fast Trips Down Coast.

The ice king has established his reign over the river routes along the coast, and everything is closed for the present. The O. R. & N. Co.'s Snake River steamers were the first to go to the bank, the Lewiston and Spokane tying up on Saturday. An effort was made to get the Steamer Dalles City to the same port, but the ice was running so heavy that she was unable to get beyond Log Cabin point. The steamer Dalles City, in command of Captain Sherman Short, arrived from The Dalles about 5 o'clock last evening, and will be the last boat to the port until the ice breaks up. The Dalles City did not take chances on getting away from her home port as scheduled yesterday morning, but left there Sunday night, and came down the Hood River. This was a fortunate move, for yesterday morning the river was blocked as far down as Memaloose Island, and there was heavy running ice all the way down to the mouth of the Willamette last evening, to be out of the way of drifting ice. The Astoria boats met small quantities of ice, but were not on navigation. Another 48 hours like that which has just passed, however, would make it quite interesting for the lower river boats, and would interfere with the deep-water fleet.

The steamer Tacoma, which is running on opposite days to the Dalles City, did not start out yesterday morning, her owners being advised of the impossibility of getting her through. The United States Vancouver route requires considerable ice floating, but not enough to prevent her making regular trips yesterday. It is feared, however, that she will encounter more trouble today, and she was expected to come back to the mouth of the Willamette last evening, to be out of the way of drifting ice. TWO VESSELS Labeled.

Another Chapter in the Hard-Luck Story of the Henriette.

The trials and tribulations which were bested the diminutive French bark Henriette did not end with the sinking of the unlucky bark in Astoria harbor. In fact, fate seems to have just opened out a new chapter in the hard-luck story. The sunken vessel was labeled yesterday by Balfour, Guthrie & Co., of this city, who allege that they are the owners of the cargo. They not only seek to obtain possession of their property, but they also ask for damages to the extent of \$2500, the vessel having failed to deliver the cargo as agreed upon. The label suit was instituted as a matter of protection to the owners of the cargo, as the French Consul agent, C. Henri Labbe, acting under orders from the Consul-General in France, had asked for the ship and cargo at public auction at Astoria tomorrow. This attempt of the French Consul to sell property in which neither the ship nor the French government had any interest is the strangest of the many strange things which have occurred since the French ships began coming to Portland. The Frenchmen may not be very great, but they are certainly proving experts at providing items, local and international regarding the movements of their subsidized craft.

OVERDUE VESSELS.

Several Ships Have Been Added to the List. SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 27.—Several vessels were added to the overdue list at the Merchants Exchange today. The French bark Oliver De Cluson, 140 days from Cayenne, bound for San Francisco, is quoted at 10 per cent. The French bark Les Adelphes, from Madagascar for Portland, Or., 104 days out, is listed at 10 per cent. The French bark Ernest Lejeune, 125 days out from Mauritius for Oregon, is also quoted at 10 per cent. The Alice McDonald has been raised to 20 per cent.

Grain Fleet Movements.

It is an unusual condition of trade when vessels carrying grain and coming in ballast for grain enter a port at the same time. None of the grain fleet now in port loading finished yesterday, but one or two will get away today. The Ananrus arrived down at Astoria yesterday. Her and the Scottish Minster are now the only vessels in the lower harbor, except the disengaged Fulwood.

STREETS IN THIBBETS TRACT.

After Many Difficulties Wedge-shaped Addition Is Planned.
