MANILA, P. I.—(Special Correspondence.)—The undeveloped timber resources of the Philippine Islands are today perhaps attracting the attention of nearly as many investors as the gold fields of California and as many young men who have visions of future wealth as did the gold excitement of the Klondike.

The American transports probably leave the most hopeful of the new arrivals, and these are generally school teachers or nurses, who have obtained passage under contract to secure a living in the islands.
