

BIG STUDENTS' RIOT

10,000 People Join Them at St. Petersburg.

NO FATALITIES ARE REPORTED

Many Persons Injured, and Probably 100 Arrests Made—Large Force of Police and Cavalry Busy Throughout the Day.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 16.—A student riot here, in which over 10,000 people engaged, kept a large force of police and cavalry busy throughout the day.

The students placarded the city last night announcing that they intended to hold a grievance meeting, and the authorities, taking the hint, made extensive preparations.

The students of St. Petersburg, on Sunday, March 17, 1901, organized what was intended to be an imposing demonstration in front of the Cathedral of Our Lady of Kazan, the occasion being the anniversary of the death of Nero.
