

REFUSES TO YIELD

Belgian Government Defies the Socialists.

WILL NOT CONSENT TO REVISION

Liberal Manifesto Demands Disolution and an Appeal to the Judgment of the Electorate.

BRUSSELS, April 15.—The government has firmly declined to yield on the question of revision, and unless King Leopold should override the Ministry, there seems to be nothing to prevent the development of a serious situation.

In the Chamber of Deputies this afternoon, M. Neujean presented a manifesto on behalf of the Liberal members of the left, demanding in order to enable the country to pronounce judgment on the revision question. This manifesto pointed out that the time is critical and the government should consent to a loyal and constitutional settlement, and it could not be construed as a surrender to popular disorder.

At this point M. De Weert, a Catholic Deputy, who, although not a Ministerialist, is a powerful adherent of the government, jumped up and exclaimed: "There is no civil war, but only evilly directed negotiations. You must have patience, but you shall not have it."

The president then declared the incident closed and the House rose. Tomorrow the socialist members of the Chamber will present their demand for universal suffrage. This will inevitably be defeated, and it is feared that this defeat will lead to trouble, particularly in the provinces.

No noteworthy incident occurred today in the streets of the city. The authorities have taken extraordinary measures to avert disorders, and the whole quarter comprising the Chamber, Deputies, the Palace and the Ministry, is kept in complete isolation from the rest of the city by cordons of the city guard.

The Socialists are pleased with the Liberal manifesto and support its demands. The strikes in Brussels and its environs is of a minor character, but in the industrial districts it is today more formidable than ever.

The appeal of the Socialist leaders for a demonstration at the Chamber of Deputies tomorrow has created some uneasiness. A number of shopkeepers have barricaded their windows, and it is rumored tonight that the cabdrivers and tramway men will strike.

In consequence of the disorders the pupils of several communal schools have been dismissed and the premises utilized as barracks for the troops. All the factories and mines at Morlanwelz, Valere and Mabilbe have been closed.

A Socialist disturbance occurred last night at Namur. A mob stoned the police, who charged with drawn swords. Subsequently a force of gendarmes scattered the rioters.

The strike is steadily extending in both this city and its suburbs, especially at Molenbeek, where a number of large factories have stopped work. The military and police have taken more stringent measures to give order to the city.

The Burgomaster has refused the Socialists' request to be allowed to follow their own devices in burying the Socialist killed during Saturday's riots. Orders have been issued for the windows to be held at 6 o'clock in the morning, without bands or funeral emblems. Otherwise the interment must be carried out at night.

It is estimated that the strikers in the Charleroi district now number 100,000. There are frequent parades there, but the town is generally peaceful, in accordance with the directions of the strike leaders.

At Louvree 35,000 men are on strike. A soldier who raised additional cries at Houdegnies has been sentenced to six months' imprisonment.

Dispatches from Ghent, Liege and elsewhere in the provinces show that the strike is extending. At Horstal, 1500 employees of the National arms factory walked out.

All the approaches to the Parliament building here are occupied by civic guards.

From Renais, in Flanders, some dynamite outrages have been reported and an attempt was made to set fire to a chateau belonging to M. Malandier, an ex-Deputy. But nowhere was any serious damage done.

Several arrests have been made in Brussels and in the provinces as a result of collisions with the police.

The executive department of the International Socialist Bureau has issued a manifesto appealing to workers in all countries to support them in their struggle against revision. They declare a general strike to be held on May 1, and they are already out and that this number will be doubled tomorrow as a protest against the attempt by the government to terrorize the workers.

SOUTH CHINA REBELLION.—All efforts by the government to suppress it are unavailing.

VICTORIA, B. C., April 15.—The situation in South China, where the rebellion is assuming large proportions, is most serious. The Japan Times says that the telegrams from Kwang Si show that a disturbance resembling the Boxer outbreak of two years ago is going on there, and the Japanese paper alleges that the trouble is being fomented by the French; that it may give Russia and that country the pretext for putting in practice the joint announcement made by them when their recent treaty was announced, and serious complications may be looked for in consequence. The Chinese Government is using every effort to suppress the rebellion, but the efforts have been unavailing, and many of the trained soldiers sent against the rebels have deserted to them.

According to a story from another source, the rebellion was fomented through the Governor of Kwang Si, who was won over to the French cause by secret envoys from the French office, and the Japanese paper alleges that the trouble is being fomented by the French; that it may give Russia and that country the pretext for putting in practice the joint announcement made by them when their recent treaty was announced, and serious complications may be looked for in consequence. The Chinese Government is using every effort to suppress the rebellion, but the efforts have been unavailing, and many of the trained soldiers sent against the rebels have deserted to them.

A battle occurred between the rebel and the government forces under General Ma Yuh Kwan, March 18, and, although the imperial officer reports that his forces killed 1000 rebels, with the loss of 80 of his own men, the rebels continued to advance. The battle took place in a valley, and the imperial troops surprised the rebels, who advanced right up to the masked batteries of the government forces, which opened fire on them at close quarters. The first discharge of the government batteries caused a heavy loss of life, but the rebels were not disheartened, for they charged the batteries and captured and destroyed the field guns of the government forces. The imperial troops fled, leaving 50 dead, after five hours of hard fighting at close quarters.

The rebels have robbed in a wholesale manner along their line of march, despoiling the people, rich and poor. They have killed a number of villages, and killed the mandarins of the several towns which endeavored to resist them. The commander of the French Eastern squadron offered to dispatch 500 bluejackets to assist the Chinese Government troops, but the Viceroy of Kwang Si declined any assistance from the French commander.

In Honan the tax riots have culminated in another insurrection in the north, the great trouble being in the districts of Kang Yang and Tung Po. After a short siege the church at Pi Yang was captured and burned, 1500 people being thrown on the flames and burned to death. Two others escaped. The insurrection in Honan is due to the disaffection arising from the burden of the indemnity in consequence of the late Boxer outbreak.

Big Plans of the Rebels. HONG KONG, April 15.—A report has reached here that the rebels in Kwang Si Province intend to seize three provinces in Southern China, namely, Yunan, Kwang Si and Kwang Tung, and establish an independent government. The rebels announce, however, that they will endeavor not to interfere with foreign trade, and that they will not attack Canton until the province mentioned have been thoroughly reduced. By this course of action, they hope to avoid collision with troops of foreign powers.

Loubet Accepts Invitation. PARIS, April 15.—At a Cabinet meeting held at the Elysee Palace today the Foreign Minister, M. Delcasse, communicated to his colleagues the text of the letter from President Loubet inviting the President Loubet in the most cordial terms to send representatives to attend the inauguration of the Rochambeau monument at Washington, May 24.

He said the President Loubet had been instructed to Jules Cambon, had been instructed to express to President Roosevelt the warm thanks of President Loubet and the Government of France, and to inform the President that a mission consisting of a General and Admiral and other officers will be sent to the United States on board French warships.

Illness of Queen Wilhelmina. THE HAGUE, April 15.—The indisposition of Queen Wilhelmina, which, it was said yesterday, was due to a simple cold, is developing complications which caused the Queen's physician to start today to visit her daughter at Castle Loo. Two physicians are in attendance on the young Queen, and Professor Halbert, a noted specialist, has been called in for consultation.

KILLED BY EXPLOSION. Woman Blows Out of an Upper-Story Window. SACRAMENTO, Cal., April 15.—Mrs. Wiley York was killed today by a gasoline explosion that was so severe that it blew her out of an upper-story window. Her body was burned to a crisp, and if it were not for the fact that she was wearing a heavy coat, she would have been killed. She was engaged in cleaning a mattress with gasoline, and evidently used a candle to light the room. The flames were subdued by the fire department, but the loss being fatal. Mrs. York was 55 years of age. Her son, Algermon, formerly a policeman in this city, now resides in Seattle.

Four Are Asphyxiated. NEW YORK, April 15.—Four persons were found dead tonight in the living apartments of Esther Cohen, a widow, on Third avenue. They had been killed by inhaling the fumes of a gas stove which had exploded. Esther Cohen, aged 50; Henry Cohen, her son, aged 21; Lena Cohen, her daughter, aged 17; Edith Flow, a friend of the Cohens, aged 15. Henry Cohen was found lying on a lounge in the parlor, and the other three were in bed in another room. All the windows, flannel and entrance doors had been tightly closed. The unlighted gas jets were turned on in the parlor where Henry lay.

Amalgamated Convention. WHEELING, W. Va., April 15.—The 27th annual convention of the Amalgamated Association of Iron, Steel and Tin Workers opened here yesterday. The city's welcome to the 250 delegates was voiced by Mayor Sweeney, and the resolutions were by President Shaffer and other officials. A committee on credentials was appointed, to which was referred the many cases of contested seats, nearly all of which were based on failure to pay strike assessments levied by the National officers. The wage committee continues its sessions daily.

Vote of Confidence Defeated. VICTORIA, B. C., April 15.—A vote of want of confidence in the Dunsmuir government, moved by the leader of the opposition, was voted down in the Legislature today by 19 to 15, both sides having a member absent. A second motion of a similar tenor, based on the contract entered into between the government and the Canadian Northern Railway, is now under discussion. It is likely that it will be defeated by an even larger majority, as two members of the opposition are opposed to it.

Minister Kills Himself. LACONIA, Ia., April 15.—Rev. Samuel Krell, pastor of the Methodist Church here, and who had served two years in the Fifty-first Iowa volunteer regiment, committed suicide today. He was dependent on his inability to secure a larger attendance at his church meetings.

HITCH IN NEGOTIATIONS

BOERS' REQUEST FOR AN ARMISTICE IS REFUSED.

England Declines to Put Cape Rebels on Same Footing as Burgers or Withdraw Proclamation.

LONDON, April 15.—The Daily Mail, in its issue this morning, says it understands a serious hitch has occurred in the peace negotiations in South Africa. The Cabinet has decided to refuse a strongly worded request from the Boer leaders for an armistice pending the negotiations. This alone is not likely to cause the Boers to withdraw from the conference, says the Daily Mail, but what threatens to stop the negotiations is the fact that the government declines to place the Cape rebels on the

same footing as the Burgers with respect to amnesty and is not inclined to withdraw the banishment proclamation. These features are regarded by the Boers as two cardinal principles in the irrevocable settlement of terms which Lord Milner went to Pretoria to ascertain and in return for which the Boers agree to the loss of independence and a general surrender. Their other demands, continues the Daily Mail, are that the Boers shall rebuild and restock the farms, take over the legal claims and liabilities of the two republics and grant a representative government within a shorter period than now contemplated.

The government leader, A. J. Balfour, replying to a question in the House of Commons, announced that the Ministers had no information of the fact that they had any more news to communicate.

WAR LOAN ADOPTED. Hicks Beach Discusses the Financial Prospects of South Africa.

LONDON, April 15.—During the course of the debate in the House of Commons today on the resolution authorizing a loan of £20,000,000, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, Sir Michael Hicks-Beach, said the grant for relieving the financial difficulties of the operation of the provisions of the Brussels sugar conference, would probably not exceed £500,000, but assistance was necessary if the sugar producers were to be saved from absolute ruin.

Discussing the financial prospects of South Africa, the Chancellor said both the Transvaal and Orange River colonies would be able to share in the cost of the war. He believed that within a few years, certain sources of revenue, representing a capital of the value of £20,000,000, would be set aside for this purpose.

Regarding the reports of difficulties between himself and the Colonial Secretary, Joseph Chamberlain, the Chancellor admitted they had a little difference of opinion.

The resolution providing for the loan of £20,000,000 was adopted by 228 to 103 votes. The loan is to be raised by an issue of 3 1/2 per cent consols.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer, Sir Michael Hicks-Beach, in answer to a question, said a rebate would not be allowed on forward grain contracts, as was allowed in the case of coal contracts last year.

The Chancellor added, pending the decision of the House of Commons, that he could not say on the spur of the moment whether the term "grain" included haricot beans, peas, etc., but he was inclined to think they were included in that term.

Sir William Vernon Harcourt (Liberal) characterized Sir Michael Hicks-Beach's expectation of Transvaal revenue as "golden dreams" useful only for floating fresh mining companies. The speaker declared the Government lacked the moral courage to put the war tax, on the present generation, who were responsible for the war, but he proposed to lay the burden on posterity.

Death From Vaccination. KENOSHA, Wis., April 15.—Ellen Marie Youngquist, aged 17 years, is dead in this city as a result of vaccination. The young woman was vaccinated several weeks ago, and since that time she has been ill. The illness finally terminated in rheumatism of the heart, which caused her death.

Begin to Be a Cardinal. NEW YORK, April 15.—Advices from well-informed vatican circles, says the Herald, state that the pope, at the vatican synod in May, will fill the vacancy among the cardinals, will elevate Mgr. Begin, archbishop of Quebec.

55,000,000 of the latter half of the loan has been taken by leading financial houses in New York.

The Daily Chronicle says it was rumored that a syndicate headed by J. Pierpont Morgan had secured a substantial slice of the loan at a price below 92. The Times, in its financial article, confirms the statement that the new loan is to be raised by an issue of consols and says they will be issued immediately at 92 1/2.

Effect of Budget on Markets. LONDON, April 15.—The budget proposals presented to the House of Commons yesterday were received fairly well on the Stock Exchange today, where the various departments developed no particular feature, with the exception of a drop in consols on selling preparatory to the issue of the new loan. Operators on the exchange continued to be hopeful as to the outlook of the peace conference at Pretoria.

SEATTLE, April 15.—Dal Hawkins went down to defeat before Perry Queenan at the Armory tonight, after one of the prettiest fights ever staged in Seattle. The end came with startling suddenness.
