

DOGS ON DEBENT

They Bark to Their Heart's Content at Bench Show.

ENGLISH EXHIBITS EQUALED

Judge Mansell Commends Variety and Quality of Animals Entered—Honors Scattered in Yesterday's Award.

The 286 dogs now on exhibition at the bench show of the Portland Kennel Club continued their yelping, snarling and barking all day yesterday, and the din and tumult around the Exposition building was louder even than on Wednesday. The dogs, at least most of them, appeared to enjoy the second day of the show, for their tails wagged pleasantly when spectators passed the rows of kennels, and most of them seemed to be in delight with their chance to bark, even though barking was forbidden by the rules of the show. Some of them uttered very painful groans, but they did so just to keep company with the others, for loud-voiced dogs are superior to popular. Hundreds of people visited the show yesterday, and it was the general opinion among the unprejudiced ones that the exhibition is the finest ever given on the Pacific coast. Although some of the California bench shows have displayed more dogs, none of them have excelled the Portland show in variety and quality of animals.

English Shows Equaled. Mr. Mansell, the English expert, who is judging the dogs, says that the present exhibit equals many of the best English shows, and that some of the dogs, particularly the pointers, are superior to those of the recent Boston show. This comment is pleasing indeed to the local fanciers, and they have reason to feel proud of the exhibition.

A number of the individual dogs that have been benched in the Portland show have national reputations, and many others are acquiring honors which will make them famous. The work of judging was continued yesterday afternoon and evening, and will be taken up again today at 2 P. M. Mr. Mansell's absolute fairness is apparent to all who have watched the results, and his ability is demonstrated by the way he goes about his work. Portland dogs have fared particularly well in the winning of prizes, especially those of the Portland Cocker Kennels, and the fox terriers belonging to William B. Feuchelmer. Other Northwest cities, including Seattle, Victoria, Pendleton, Walla Walla and the California Kennels, have won a fair share of honors, and the best of feeling prevails among all the exhibitors.

Last evening the treated dogs belonging to C. H. Hunt gave a fine exhibition on a raised platform in each hall, and this feature will be repeated tonight, tomorrow night and tomorrow afternoon. The latter puppy show was given away last evening by F. H. Flemming was drawn by Mrs. A. H. Kerr.

TO BUILD BIG WAREHOUSE

ADVANCE THRESHER COMPANY BUYS EAST SIDE SITE.

Two-Story Structure Will Be Erected on Half-Block on East Belmont Street.

The half-block on Belmont street, between East Water and East First streets, has just been purchased by the Advance Thresher Company, for the purpose of building a warehouse. The new building will be two stories, with a basement, 100x30, covering the half-block. The price paid for the property has not been made public, as the deed has not been filed.

The Advance Thresher Company is a large firm, and will put up a fine building. It will be the third structure of the sort to go up in this district this year, the other two being the Studebaker and the Deere Food Company buildings, each costing \$30,000.

It is not known how soon the Advance Thresher Company will build, but it is understood that it will put up the proposed warehouse this year, and it will be the equal of any of the large structures in this district.

Method of Cutting Down the Evans Blocks by Staking a Success.

Owing to the breaking of some parts of the machinery, Lind & Manning, who have the contract for moving about 30,000 cubic yards of dirt from the Dudley Evans block on Russell street, Alameda, have temporarily suspended sluicing while repairs are being made. Enough work has been done to show that this method of moving the dirt can be carried out successfully. A larger and more powerful boiler has been installed, and the sluice in the pipe extending from the pump to the blocks to be cut down have been stopped. When everything is in readiness the dirt will be sluiced down into Montgomery's ravine very rapidly.

COSTS MORE TO EAT MEAT

RESTAURANT MEN ABOUT TO MARK UP PRICES.

"We've Got to Live," They Say, "and We Cannot Live on a Starvation Basis."

Up goes meat diet in the restaurants. One vegetarian can get even. Most restaurants will soon be advanced 5 cents a plate, and withal, even at the coming of the present prices may feed the public, said a restaurateur last night. "But they starve us. It's hungry people eat meat, but between the poor proprietors in their hard fight for business it's the same as dog eat dog. We love the public? Why, of course, but that's why we must have higher prices. If we didn't, you know, we couldn't feed the dear public."

The proprietors point out that prices of supplies and wages of cooks and waiters have gone up so high in the past few years that they do not get fair returns for their labor. This is the cheapest restaurant town in the United States, said a proprietor last night. "Why don't we go elsewhere? Well, we love Portland. If we got out we wouldn't stay here, and the people need restaurants."

The common price of an ordinary stein steak at a restaurant, including bread, butter, potatoes and coffee, is 25 cents. This price ranges up to 40 and 50 cents for special orders. Mutton or pork chops are usually served for 15 cents. The great institution, ham and eggs, will remain unmolested at 20 and 25 cents.

Proprietors held a meeting last Monday night. They discussed their tribulations in squares, circles and triangles, and if there was anything they forgot to talk about they do not remember it. One gentleman with prehensile fingers and a starved appearance wanted to jack up all the prices, but his benevolent colleagues did not allow it. The following week Monday night another pow-wow will be held. Gold-embroidered invitations are being sent out.

There were also submitted to the voters questions of municipal ownership of street railways, gas and electric lighting plants, and for direct primaries. CONTRACT NOT YET HERE

Port of Portland Gets Letter from Drydock Builders.

A conference of members of the Port of Portland Commission was held yesterday afternoon to consider a letter from Faber, Du Faur & Donnelly, of New York, who have plans for a floating drydock. The letter was in answer to one sent by the Commission, asking whether the engineers were prepared to furnish a bond that the dock would operate satisfactorily for one year after the date of completion. It stated that the contract was in the hands of Frederick Lang, director of the dock, and that he had not yet received it. It is probable that Mr. Lang still has the matter of the contract in his hands, and that he is under consideration. The letter of the engineers made no further statement than that the contractors should furnish the bond.
