

LABOR IS UNITED

State Federation Organized in Portland.

ATTENDANCE OF MORE THAN 175

The Organization Will Embrace All Unions, Alliances and Other Bodies of Laborers in Oregon—Conservative Policy.

A State Federation of Labor was organized at a convention of delegates from unions throughout the state, held in Portland yesterday. All unions, alliances and other bodies of working men in the state are included in the federation. A conservative policy was counseled, and will without doubt be followed. The federation, as such, will meet today to elect officers.

The convention called for the purpose of forming a State Federation of Labor met in the A. O. U. W. Hall yesterday and effected permanent organization by the election of the following officers: President, Henry C. Gurr, president of the Portland Federated Trades Council; vice-president, James M. Murphy, of La

Grand secretary, W. H. Barry, of Portland; assistant secretary, W. Noffke, of Oregon City; a constitution and by-laws, will be adopted by the convention today, and tomorrow the officers of the federation will be elected.

The convention was called to order by Mr. Gurr at 9 A. M. More than 175 delegates from the unions of the state were in attendance, and listened to a brief address by Mr. Gurr, who spoke of the purpose for which the meeting had been called and the benefits which the workmen would derive from a State Federation. A conservative attitude in all matters was advised. On motion of W. H. Barry, Mr. Gurr was elected temporary chairman; W. Noffke, of the Painters' Union, was elected temporary secretary. A committee on credentials was appointed, consisting of George F. Harry, Sheet Metalworkers' Union; W. Booth, Bookbinders' Union; Leonard Becker, Millmen's Union; all of Portland; S. R. Haworth, Stone and Brick Masons' Union; and J. K. Fitzgerald, Federal Labor Union of La Grande; D. T. Gerdes, Federal Labor Union of Astoria; W. E. Miller, Federal Labor Union of Salem; and J. M. Howard, Federal Labor Union of Oregon City. William Blackman, State Labor Commissioner of Washington, was introduced to the assembly and made a few remarks. He outlined the work done by the federation in Washington, and spoke of its successful effort to secure the enactment of needed labor laws. A state labor bureau had been created and a law had been passed providing for the inspection of factories and coal mines.

F. Stacy Whitney, of Seattle, general organizer of the American Federation of Labor, also made a short speech. On behalf of the Washington Federation he congratulated the union men of Oregon upon their effort to form a federation, and he promised to give them all the assistance in his power.

In order to give the committee on credentials time to prepare its report, the convention adjourned until 1 P. M. The delegates assembled at that hour, but it

was nearly 3 o'clock before the committee presented its report. The committee recommended that the vote in the convention be by delegates present in the hall when the ballot is taken, each delegate being entitled to cast his own vote only. This step was taken to prevent the introduction of proxies. The list of delegates found entitled to seats showed that the membership of the unions of Portland is in the neighborhood of 700, and of the state at large between 10,000 and 11,000.
