HEAVY IRON OUTPUT.

## A Disagreement Among Associated Makers of Pig in the South.

NEW YORK. May 15.-Our monthly blast furnace statistics, says the iron age today, brings out one very interesting fact. It is that for the first time in the history of the industry we have reached the enormous output industry we have reached the enormous output of over 1,500,000 gross tons in one month. If nothing happens to disturb the regular running of the furnaces, and if the old stacks now setting ready, and the new ones building, get into line, as aspected, we may reach a pro-duction of 18,000,000 tons this year, in spite of the fact that we did not attain that rate during the first of the year. The stocks in the hands of furnaces which are sellers in the open market have declined to 65,565 tons for coles and antifractite iron, and 20,276 tons for charcoal tron, or hardly two days supply for the former. The scarcity of raw material, intermediate products and fin-

Gays supply for the former. The scarcity of raw material, intermediate products and fin-lahed iron and steel continues, and there are reports of foundries and mills closing down on that account. Yet for distant delivery there is no disposition on the part of the buyers to contract at anywhere near present prices for

prompt iron. In the South is presented a curious spectacl In the South is presented a curious spectacle in a disagreement among the associated mak-ers of pig iron. Some of them have decided to ahandon the proposition of trying to keep the market stendy by quoting \$12 for future deliveries, when iron is selling at \$15, \$16 or more for No. 3, at Hirmingham, for prompt delivery. There have been few noteworthy transactions in pig iron. The latest transac-tions were at \$19 for earlier delivery and at \$18 50 for the last months of the-year. Importations continues. 
