LONDON STOCK EXCHANGE. Short of Cash and Long on Paper Through the Week,

LONDON, May 18.—The Stock Exchange was the past week. The payments for the new tesses of consols and settlement day requirements sent borgowers to the Bank of England, while the combination of the Whitsuntide holidays and the conference of Boer lenders at Vreeniging, Transvaal, dampened all the spec-ulative enthusiasm and business was almost at a standstill for the whole week. The sweeth of the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Chamberlain, at Birmingham, was worked by the bears for much more than its real value and caused a shading in the quotations on con-sols and other funds, but could not add ma-

terially to the general inaction.

The settlement disclosed a decided increase on American account, but this principally consisted of the transferring of transactions consisted of the transferring of transactions here from New York on account of the high rates in Wall street. The quotations on home rails improved during the week, but without much actual trading. Mexican rails were quite depressed on the sliver outlook. South Americans were in rather good demand. The charse of the China Mutual Steam Navigation Company rose on the proposal to purchase the business of the commany, and this in witten husiness of the company, and this in spite of the opposition to the trainfer among the directorate. Peuding the results of the peace conference in South Africa, mines were more starnant than ever.
