urday, and, with a perplexing political campagn absorbing much attention, conditions were not conductive to a heavy volume of traile, coal retailers bought sparingly, and orders fr in the country were somewhat smaller than of the week previous. The general situation, rever, as reflected in bank clearings, is quite favorable, and no complaints are heard. Pr duce receipts were not very large, and to wards the close of the week there was a stiffening in some lines. Potatoes failed to recover much of their lost strength, although the demand was a little better on Saturday. Onlone are out of the race for the season, and the new California stock which came the steamer Friday sold as low as \$1 10 per cental. There are no more old-crop onlors in the Northwest, but there are still some pretty

good-sized lots of posstors to come out. The weather is still unfavorable for the ripening of strawberies, and the Ovegon stock as yet has out but a small figure in the market. The California betries have been of much better quality than usual, and have held up to very good figures. The Oregon berries have beer so slow in coming that it is feared that the California berries will be out of the market before Oregon are available in sufficient quantity to meet the demand. Eggs and poulboth took a slight move upward Saturday This is the season for inferior eggs, and there strictly first-class candled stock commands gulte a premium over the ordinary run of fferings. In a small way, the choice stock was seiling at 17c Saturday, and from that figure down as low as 15c. Poultry, which has been inclined to drug for a long time, also cleaned up thoroughly on Saturday at prices that were well up toward the best of the season. The grocery market showed no changes during the week, although there was some

strength reported in stuples.

WHEAT-Mov shipments (flour included), totaling less than 500,000 bushels, give a pretty good idea of the duliness of the wheat market at the present time. The East slumped away nearly all last week, closing with a loss of over 3c on the week, and Liverpool at last showed a disposition to humor the weakness on this side. Low freights have helped matters on the Pacific Coast, and prices in Portland have been less affected by changes elsewhere than ever before. While it was hardly possible to secure prices as high as were puld a week earlier, a 6de quotation on Walla Walla was still obtainable, and there was not very much wheat to be bought at that price. Two spot ships were taken during the one for South Africa and one from Puget Sor ad for the United Kingdom. The rate for the latter was not made public, but is said to have been less than 24s 6d, which was the lowest rate peviously paid this season. There s no more spot or near-by tonnage offering, but new-crop freights were not sufficiently at tractive to hold their own at 30s, and during for new season at 28s bd. The freight market in San Francisco is also much weaker, and the Commercial News, under date of May 29, gipes up the situation as follows:

In the freight market the week has pass with a very small amount of activity, but two spot grain charters being made in north, and one at this port.
