WILL FACE NEW CHARGES

CHARLES SAVAGE, WHO WAS ACQUITTED OF DIAMOND ROBBERY. Superintendent Nevins Believes He Is Guilty of Robbing Salt Lake and Denver Postoffices. Charles Savage, who was acquitted on a charge of having stolen \$6000 worth of diamonds from Alfred Lowenthal in the Portland Hotel, and who was arrested Thursday for the robbery of the postoffice in Denver, is, in the opinion of Superintendent Nevins, the Pinkerton agency, guilty of a number of other crimes.

SHOT WHILE BUTTING A REVOLVER.—A somewhat unexpected ending to the purchase of a revolver took place last night in a Third-street second-hand store, when Francis Dumont was accidentally shot in the left arm. Dumont and a friend named Reinhard went into the store to sample the revolver, and while one of the weapons, 32 caliber, was being examined by Reinhard, snap went the trigger, and the bullet, striking an object on the wall, rebounded and buried itself in Dumont's arm near the shoulder.
