

## CORN CRUMPS AGAIN

## Bull Crowd Pushes July Up, to Seventy-Eight.

## CLOSE IS FOUR CENTS LOWER

## Wet Weather Causes Wheat to Take a Leap and Close One and a Quarter Cents Higher—Oats Have Active Trade.

July corn opens at 72 1/2, advances to 76 1/2, then to 78, and closes at 78 1/2. The fluctuations in price show that the bull crowd means to carry the corn through to a finish. The first sale of 30,000 bushels of corn delivered at the close of yesterday. During the next two hours shorts bid the market steadily up to 76 1/2. There was reason for the bid, for the whole 2,000,000 bushels went to Hays, Gates & Co. This firm is credited with having about 10,000,000 bushels of corn delivered this month. The contract closes at 76 1/2. On this basis, the bulls let out some corn under which July priced down to 76 1/2. Here another endeavor to cover at this concession set the price within five minutes to 78. The bull crowd here let out more stuff at the close, and the market advanced to 78 1/2. The September options advanced on the weather and is sympathy with July from 65 to 64 1/2. But September sold heavily by the July manipulators and others, and closed 1/2 down at 64 1/2.

Wheat-traders, like those in corn, seemed to take a more cheerful view of the crop situation early, but later in the day the weather map, with prospects of more rain where anything but moisture is wanted, dampened the excitement of yesterday, and prices promptly went on a record-breaking tour, July from 74 1/2 to 76 1/2 at the opening to 78 1/2, while September advanced to 75 1/2. It was a crowd of shorts who did the bidding, led by St. Louis interests, which were credited with buying close to 2,000,000 bushels of July, and about 1,000,000 bushels of September. On the bulls, however, trading was made in heavy quantities, and both July and September receded, the former however, closing 1/2 higher at 78 1/2, and the latter 1/2 up at 74 1/2.

In oats there was nothing like the trade of yesterday, yet the market was an active one, a reduced counterpart of corn. September closed 1/2 higher at 35 1/2. The leading futures are as follows:

## WASHINGTON, July 1.—The weather bureau's weekly summary of crop conditions in the northern portion of the country east of the Rocky Mountains has experienced another decidedly good week, with generally abundant rainfall.
