

TO DEFEND COAST

Puget Sound to Have Artillery Posts.

\$240,000 HAS BEEN SET ASIDE

Fort Casey and Worden the Points Selected—Greater Protection Against Foreign Enemies Is the End Desired.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, July 21.—The War Department has taken steps to defend Puget Sound more effectively against foreign enemies by authorizing the construction of coast artillery posts at Fort Casey and Worden.

A general sum has been set aside for erecting small buildings and making repairs at the Coast Artillery posts, which will include work at the mouth of the Columbia River.

BIDS ON SITES OPENED. Offers for Public Buildings at Tacoma and Spokane.

WASHINGTON, July 21.—The State Department has received a cablegram from Consul-General Gudgeon at Panama, dated yesterday, as follows: "Fighting at long range, five miles out between Panama and Colón and two government vessels. No damage done."

Port of Carupano Closed. WILLEMSTAD, Island of Curacao, July 21.—The Official Gazette, of Curacao, publishes an official decree adding Carupano to the list of ports closed to trade and declared to be blockaded.

WASHINGTON, July 21.—A cablegram received at the State Department from United States Minister Bowman, at Caracas, stated that the Venezuelan Government had announced that the port of Carupano is blocked.

More Trouble in Haiti. PORT AU PRINCE, Hayti, July 21.—The situation in Hayti has become worse. General Jean Jumeau, who supports the candidacy for the Presidency of M. Firmin, is on his way to the capital, and General Salnave, with a considerable force, has started for Cape Haytien in order to attack General Nord, the War Minister.

Cincinnati Goes to Barcelona. CARACAS, July 21.—The United States cruiser Cincinnati has left this port for Barcelona, a United States gunboat is anchored at La Guayra.
