

GLENN IS CONVICTED

Permitted Water-Cure to Be Administered to Natives.

SUSPENDED AND FINED

Ladrones Chiefs in Cavite Province Break Through the Constabulary Cordon and Escape to the Hills.

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Secretary Root today sent to the President at Oyster Bay the proceedings in a charge of a military case of Major Edwin F. Glenn, Fifth Infantry, Lieutenant Julian E. Gaudot, Tenth Cavalry, and Lieutenant Norman E. Cook, Filipino scouts. Glenn was found guilty of administering the water-cure to natives, or permitting it to be done, and was sentenced to one month's suspension from duty and fined \$50.

BROKE THROUGH THE CORDON.

Ladrones Chiefs Escape From Cavite Province.

MANILA, July 22.—Constabulary and Ferrario, the ladrones chiefs, have broken through the constabulary cordon in Cavite Province and have escaped to the mountains. The cordon encompassed the leaders and many of the followers. It was broken, when trapped, made a series of breaks to escape. The constabulary withstood the first attacks, killing 11 and capturing 15 men. The ladrones finally managed to break cover of the darkness and forced their way through a weak spot in the cordon, near Dasames, killing one and wounding one of the constabulary. The latter captured the constabulary and the leaders and destroyed quantities of supplies.

An extensive drive, with the object of capturing the ladrones chiefs Montolio and Ferrario and 50 of their followers, was organized in Cavite Province. Twelve hundred constabulary, commanded by Captain Baker, moved last Thursday at daylight, forming a complete angle-shaped cordon, covering 60 square miles. Patrol launches guarded the rivers, and it was expected to close the cordon last Saturday. The entire male population of the towns and farms were to be included in the concentration movement. When complete, the ladrones were to have been arrested and the others were to have been released.

General Theodore J. Wint has been assigned to command the Second Brigade in North Luzon. General Jesse M. Lee goes to Batangas when General Franklin M. Bell is relieved.

Cholera continues to decrease in the city and provinces. The authorities think the epidemic is less virulent.

THE POPE'S GIFTS.

Taft Uncertain Whether or Not He Could Receive Them.

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Governor Taft has acquainted Secretary Root with the fact reported in the news dispatches from Rome that the pope desires to send several pretty and appropriate gifts to himself and the members of his party and he has asked whether they can be lawfully accepted. It was a matter of official inquiry. On the other hand, if the gifts are of exceptional value, which is not believed to be the case, they may be deposited in the Smithsonian Institution in this city.

Papal Representatives at Manila.

ROME, July 22.—Besides an apostolic delegate for the Philippine Islands, the Vatican is preparing to appoint an archbishop vicar general for the islands. Bishop Sebastian Gebhard Messmer (a Swiss), professor of canon law at the Catholic University in Washington since 1910. Three new Philippine dioceses will also be created.

Transport Summer Arrives.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 22.—The United States transport summer arrived today from Manila. She brought more than 1600 cabin passengers, mostly officers and their families; 300 enlisted men of the Seventeenth Infantry, and 236 of the Twenty-fourth. There were two deaths during the voyage. Private Richard Johnson, of the Twenty-fourth Infantry, died of pneumonia and Sergeant John Kelly, of the Seventh, who was on his way home to be retired, succumbed to a general breaking down.

Reward for Missing Men.

TELLURIDE, Colo., July 22.—The Board of County Commissioners has offered a reward of \$500, and the Liberty Bell and the Smuggler-Union Mining Companies a similar amount for information leading to the cause of the death or disappearance of W. J. Barney and W. E. Smith, miners who mysteriously disappeared from this place about a year ago. The impression prevails that the mining companies believe both men were murdered.

Revenue From Chinese Immigration.

OTTAWA, Ont., July 22.—The gross revenue from Chinese immigration to Canada for the year ending June 30 amounts to \$264,972, compared with \$173,704 during the previous year. The poll tax last year was raised from \$50 to \$100. The number who paid the tax was 225, compared with 2213 in 1919.

PARIS: RELIGIOUS RIOTS

GOVERNMENT FIRMLY LASHES CLERICALS TO FURY.

Street Fighting Before the School of an Unauthorized Congregation—Other Disturbances.

PARIS, July 22.—After the distribution of prizes at a school belonging to an unauthorized congregation in the Avenue Parmentier here today, violent scenes were witnessed in the streets. The government's action in closing the establishments of unauthorized congregations. Fighting ensued, the crowds breaking through the police cordon and shouting "Vive la liberte." As a matter of fact, however, the clericals are manifesting a hopelessness. Many municipal councils in France are denouncing the government's action, and some are voting resolutions approving the government's action.
