LISBON, July 25.—A dispatch from Azores Islands says there has just been a terrific submarine volcanic eruption off Ponta, Island of Fayal.

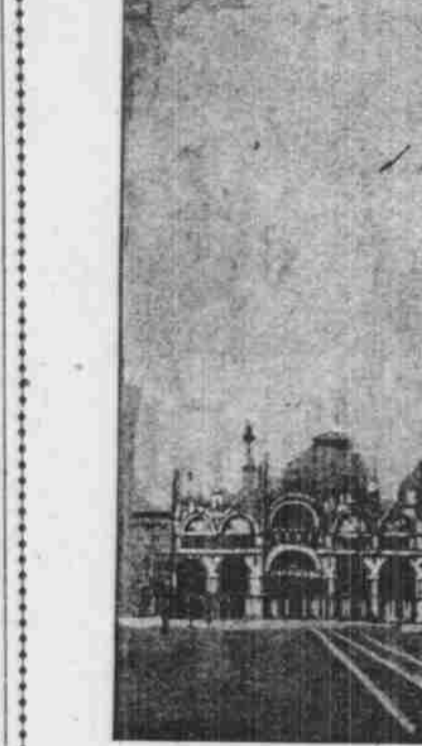
King Reported Better.

AID WAS IMPOSSIBLE

SEVERAL PERSONS BURNED TO DEATH IN OHIO TRAIN WRECK.

Three Bodies Have Been Recovered, but a Number of the Passengers Are Still Missing.

TREBEHNS, O., July 25.—One of the most appalling wrecks in the history of the Pennsylvania road occurred here at 10:30 o'clock last night, when the limited from St. Louis to New York, a heavy train, composed of an engine, two mail cars, day coach and four Pullman sleepers, while running at 70 miles an hour, crashed into a wild flat car loaded with coal coming down grade toward it at a rate of 25 miles an hour.
