While prices are nominally unohanged, there is less disposition on the part of buyers to crowd matters. The situation in New York is thus reported by the Journal of Commerce of July 24: thus reported by the Journal of Commerce of July 24: "Supplies in brewers' hands were generally understood to be very moderate; nevertheless brewers were inclined to go slow in making contracts for forward deliveries. The slight improvement reported latterly in the state crop outlook and the slightly better cable advices new coming to hand from London have a de-terring influence. Mail advices received from up the state complain of the beavy reinfall of the past few days in some sections; still forms of the local trade are inclined to the opinion that the crop as a whole is showing an improvement and are now talking a yield of from 50 to 60 per cent of last year's crop. 
