### **Nile Dam Nearly Completed.**

NEW YORK, Aug. L-Announcement is made that the list coping stone of the Nile dam at Assouan was laid on Wednesday, says a Times dispatch from London. The Nlie reservoir, for which the great dams at Assouan and Assolun have been constructed, will enable wide tracts of land to hear two crops a year instead of one; will bring waste districts into tillage and will greatly increase the area of sugar cultivition. The reservoir will supply 1,000,000,000 cubic meters of water annually. The dam at Assouan is one and one-quarter miles long. The works at Assouan probably will be fin-

### Annexation Talk in Jamalca.

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Aug. 1,-The Chamber of Commerce has passed a res-olution condemning the imperial governent's neglect of the West Indies, and resolving not to notice the proposed grant of £10,000. Several speakers urged the idea of annexation to the United States, and the newspapers are devoting columns to serious discussion of the matter.
