C., Tacoma, by way of Shanghai, Kobe and Yokohama, dragged her anchors and collided with the British steamer Wing Sang, of the Indo-China Steam Navigation Company's fleet.

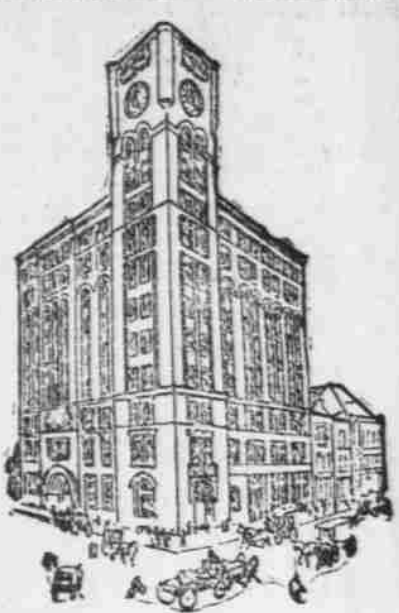
Goody Catches of Cod.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 5.—The cod fishing fleet is doing well in the north on July 9, the barkentine Fremont was spoken in Behring Sea, with a catch of 15,000 fish, and on the same date the schooner Arago, with 50,000 codfish, was spoken. All were well on both vessels.
