DISCUSS CLAIMS IN SECRET

Board of Public Works Considers Suit of Deputies for Back Pay.

The Board of Public Works has been discussing in secret sessions the claims of J. W. Brown, A. M. Shannon, George F. Bodman, William Braden and E. Rueter, deputies in the City Engineer's office, for back salaries and it is reported that the members of the board are not pleased with the course pursued by the deputies, and are after their scalps.

The fact that these claims have been presented to the Common Council and rejected, and that the men have sued the city to recover the money, has heretofore been published. The claims amount to \$68 each for each year from July 1, 1918, to September 1, 1922. An ordinance passed by the Common Council fixed the salaries of the deputies at \$90 per month each.

The salaries were reduced by City Engineer Chase to \$5 per month, because it is said he did not desire to increase the expenses of his office, and he had to employ another man in order to pay a political debt.

City Attorney Long rendered an opinion in the case favorable to the men, part of which bearing upon the law is as follows: "Our Supreme Court has laid down the rule in two cases that the officers of the city are without authority to reduce salaries, and that the act is illegal and void. In cases, however, where a man accepts a reduced salary, notwithstanding the fact that the reduction was illegal and void, then he is bound to the reduction in the nature of a settlement with the city and an estoppel.

The men claim that they never agreed to a reduction, but always protested against it. It is also stated that the city had authority to pass the laws or to represent the city, and always insisted that they were entitled to the balance and would sue for it. There are no facts to the contrary, and the single fact of their having accepted a reduced salary.

This case differs from the firemen's cases in that as a result of their continuing to work they were reinstated in the salaries fixed by ordinance. In the firemen's cases, notwithstanding there was a protest, the old salaries were not reinstated, and after the firemen were told that they could not be reinstated, they continued to serve and draw pay at the reduced rate. Unless Mr. W. B. Chase, the City Engineer, is able to establish the fact that the men were reinstated in the reduction, so as to bring them under the rule laid down in the firemen's cases, these employees will be entitled to recover the amount due them; and from my former investigation, when advised them to repeal the ordinance, I am of the opinion that no such state of facts exists as will successfully support the city's position to deny them that amount.

Notwithstanding this opinion, the Council refused to order the claims paid, and the men returned to the city to recover in the State Circuit Court. On ascertaining that the Board of Public Works had taken the matter in hand, they have been advised to bring their case to the board as follows:

"On July 1, 1918, or soon thereafter, Mr. Chase called five deputies into his office and told them that their salaries would be reduced from \$100 to \$55 a month. Mr. Chase was informed that he was without authority to reduce salaries, and that he had placed the salaries at \$100. Then Mr. Chase explained that it would be only for a short time, when the salaries would be replaced at \$100. He said that he had placed the salaries at \$100 per month, which was the amount he put down in the ordinance. He would get whenever a protest was made. Mr. Chase put off the matter from time to time with one excuse or another, until he concluded that it was the proper time to present them to the Council. He signed the claims in the regular way and said we were clearly entitled to the money. There was no demand by the Council at that time. During Mr. Chase's three terms for a reduction of his force of deputies or of their salaries. The claims were presented in the Council on the strength of his official position, which he failed properly to account for, and he is also supposed to have swindled the city out of considerable money. When the claims were given out that he went to San Francisco and afterwards it was stated that he was in Dawson. These statements were probably made to throw the officers off the track, and to make the city believe that he was at Seattle by acquaintance on July 26. He left Portland nearly two months ago. The police will doubtless have no difficulty in finding him, when they begin active search, which has not been done heretofore.

REV. A. J. MONTGOMERY HERE. He will be installed Pastor Third Presbyterian September 24th.

At a meeting of Portland Presbytery yesterday, the pastoral relations between Rev. Andrew J. Montgomery and the Oregon City Presbyterian Church were dissolved, and the call to the Third Presbyterian Church, East Side, was placed in his hands. Mr. Montgomery will be installed as regular pastor officially by the presbytery, Thursday evening, September 25, at 7 o'clock. Rev. H. S. Templeton, moderator of the presbytery and pastor of Westminster Presbyterian Church, will preside. Rev. E. P. Hill, D. D., of the First Church, will deliver the sermon; Rev. E. M. Sharp, of Mount Taber, will deliver the charge to the pastor and Rev. D. C. McClelland will charge the people.

Mr. Montgomery and family have moved to Portland and occupy a dwelling at 27 East Fifteenth street South. He was at the prayer service last evening, and next Sunday he will preach his first sermon and declare the pulpit vacant. Although his official installation does not take place until September 25, he is the pastor for all purposes.

At a meeting of the congregation of the Oregon City Presbyterian Church, held Wednesday evening, Mr. Montgomery took leave of the church which he had served acceptably for the past eight years. Resolutions setting forth the high esteem in which Mr. Montgomery is held in that church and community were unanimously passed.
