RISE IN SOUTHERN PACIFIC REASSURES SPECULATORS.

Another Excellent Influence Was the Good Support Accorded Colorado Fuel—Money is Easier.

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—Today's stock market rallied from yesterday's depression, and closed materially higher than last night. There was a considerable contraction in the volume of the trading, and it was not until late in the day that the disturbance to sentiment caused by yesterday's break in prices was entirely overcome.

The points of strength in the early part of the day were somewhat scattered, and might be attributed to a number of causes.

The recovery of the market was due to a number of factors, including the good support accorded Colorado Fuel.
