

RESERVE IN ALASKA

President Issues an Order Creating a Second One.

SEVERAL ISLANDS EMBRACED

Will Be Known as the Alexander Archipelago, and Contains Much Valuable Timber—Officials Are Yet to Be Named.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, D. C., Aug. 22.—President Roosevelt today issued a proclamation creating the Alexander archipelago forest reserve in extreme Southeastern Alaska.

The establishment of the reserve will not deprive any bona fide inhabitant of the islands of any valid right he may possess either under the Russian treaty or acts of Congress relating to Alaska.
