Information to this effect was received from an authoritative source in Washington today.

Corruption in China

LONDON, Aug. 29.—The Shanghai correspondent of the Times cables that, besides the vote of the provincial Governor of China are utilizing the indemnity to be paid the foreign powers as a pretext for raising loans, and are corruptly appropriating large sums of money to their own purposes. As an instance of this, the correspondent cites the case of the Governor of Chekiang, who obtained a loan of \$100,000 from an American bank at Shanghai on the plea that he was unable to meet the demands of the revenue board. The Governor's application for a loan was accompanied by a particular request that the bank would communicate the Governor's difficulties to the American Minister in China.

France's New Budget

PARIS, Aug. 29.—The Minister of Finance, M. Rouvier, will present the budget at the reopening of the Chamber of Deputies. He proposes to meet the deficit by reducing the amount of untaxed alcohol hitherto allowed producers, from which he estimates to reap \$19,000,000, and by abolishing some of the exemptions from the tobacco tax, from which \$2,000,000 is expected.

Missionaries' Bodies Mutilated

LONDON, Aug. 29.—In a dispatch from Shanghai, the correspondent of the Daily Mail says the bodies of Missionaries Bruce and Lewis have been recovered, mutilated beyond recognition. The murderers made use of all kinds of weapons to kill Bruce. Lewis was speared and stoned to death.
