MEET ROOSEVELT TODAY

Five Prominent Senators Will Confer With the President.

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—Much speculation was caused tonight by the presence in the city of five of the most influential members of the United States Senate, all here on their way to meet President Roosevelt at Oyster Bay tomorrow.

The five are Senators Hanna of Ohio, Allison of Iowa, Aldrich of Rhode Island, Spooner of Wisconsin and Platt of Connecticut.
