People Are Taking Kindly to Roosevelt's Idea.

GREAT CHANGE IN SENTIMENT

President Proposes That the Board to Consider Revision of Rates Shall Study the Results of Changes on Business.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Oct. 22.—Sentiment is growing in favor of a tariff commission. Although the idea was unpopular when first advanced by President Roosevelt, it now seems to meet with considerable favor.

LULL IN APPOINTMENTS.

President Will Announce No More Until December.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—Only in a few emergency cases will the President announce the appointments before the convening of Congress in December. This decision has been reached by the President and his cabinet advisors, in order that successful appointments may not be put to the expense and annoyance of furnishing two bonds for the same period of two or three months.

English View Same as American.

LONDON, Oct. 22.—In an editorial article on the award made by King Oscar to the American press that the King of Sweden and Norway affirms a principle by which the United States must refuse to be bound, and that the American press, in a precedent, namely, that a nation compelled to land troops and bombard semi-savage people for the protection of its own citizens, cannot thereby a wrongful act.

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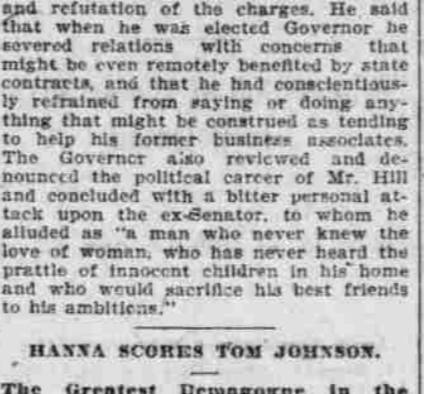

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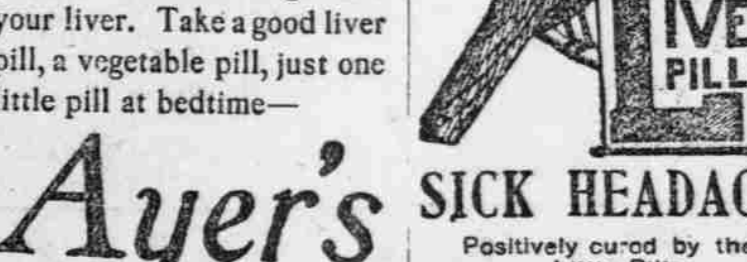
