Almost every civilized country in the world buys rice from Japan, and the exports last year were double those of 1900, although less than in 1800. The value of the rice exported last year was about four-fifths that of the tea, these two being the principal unmanufactured vegetable products exported from Japan. Other vegetable exports are barley, ginseng, groundnuts, gallnuts, oranges, mush-rooms, camphor and potatoes, the Philippine Islands being the heaviest purchaser of the last named, while the United States ranked third in the amount of rice taken. The cold weather of the first weeks of May affected the young rice shoots, and the crop for this year is somewhat doubtful. F. H. Hitchcock, chief of the section of for-

markets of the Agricultural Department, sign markets of the Agricultural Department, says rice finds considerable favor in the United Kingdom as an article of food. During 1900 this product in its various forms, including rice meal and flour, was imported into the United Kingdom to the extent of 705,009,000 pounds. The total import value was about \$12,000,000. The bulk of the rice imported in that year came from the British East Indies. from which source 525,000,000 pounds were received, the value amounting to \$8,119,000, or 69 per cent of the total. A large part of the East Indian shipments came from Burmah and Bengal. Rice was also purchased quite extensively from the Netherlands, that country being a large importer from the East Indies. The quantity of rice produced from the Netherlands was 65,000,000 pounds, and its value \$1,007,000, or 14 per cent. French Indochina was one of the important sources of supply. Among other countries from which considerable shipments were received should be mentioned Germany and Asiatic Turkey. Imports amount to 1,741,600 pounds, and valued at \$36,000, were recorded as coming from the United Staines. ively from the Netherlands, that coun-
