

LAW TO GOVERN BARBERS

PROPOSED AMENDMENT IN EXISTING LAW.

Penalty for Practicing Without License to Be Obtained After Examination by State Board.

The bill regulating the barbers of the state, as it has been amended by the Senate and as it will be presented to the Legislature for passage, is in part as follows:

"Section 1. That forthwith after the passage of this act it shall be unlawful for any person not a registered barber within the meaning of this act to pursue in any way the business of a barber, except as an apprentice registered as hereinafter provided, under the supervision of a registered barber, without the sanction of the State Board of Barber Examiners of this state."

"Section 2. It is the duty of the State Board of Barber Examiners, and extends its field of action. After outlining the duties of the board, it provides that each member shall give a \$500 bond and the treasurer a \$250 bond. It continues:

"Said board shall meet and hold examinations as hereinafter provided for, at least quarterly during each year, in at least four different cities in the state; the board shall also, by its secretary, appoint an agent who shall exercise the powers herein granted to said board, and who shall furnish a satisfactory bond to the board for the faithful performance of his duties, and his compensation shall be fixed by said board and paid out of its funds."

"Section 3. It is the duty of the board, and it says:

"All moneys received in excess of said expenses shall be held by the board as a special fund for meeting further expenses of said board, provided that when the amount collected by said board and in its possession shall exceed the sum of \$500, the surplus shall be paid to the treasurer of the State of Oregon. The board shall render a semi-annual itemized account of the work it has done to the Governor, and render a report of all moneys received and disbursed by them pursuant to this act, and the records of said board shall at all times be open to inspection by the public."

"Sec. 4. Any person desiring to obtain a certificate under this act shall make his sworn application to said board, and shall pay to the treasurer of said board an examination fee of \$5, and shall present himself at the next regular meeting of the board for the examination of applicants, whereupon said board shall proceed to examine such person, and, being satisfied as to his qualifications, his name shall be entered by the board upon the register kept by them, and a certificate issued to him; provided, that whenever it appears that the applicant has acquired this knowledge in a barber school, the board shall be the judge as to whether or not said barber school is properly appointed and conducted and under proper instruction to give sufficient training in such trade. All persons making applications under the provisions of this act shall be allowed to practice until the next regular meeting of said board."

"Sec. 5. Nothing in this act shall prohibit any person serving as an apprentice in said trade, under a barber authorized to practice the same under this act; provided, any person serving as an apprentice shall have his name registered with the secretary of the state board, and shall pay a fee of \$1 therefor, and cause to be entered on said register the date of his apprenticeship, and after serving three years as an apprentice, he will be eligible to become a registered barber after complying with the conditions of this act."

"Sec. 6. The said board shall furnish each person entitled to a certificate under this act, a card bearing the seal of the board and the signature of its president and secretary, stating that the holder thereof is entitled to practice the said trade, where he may be lawfully employed, by all persons whom he may serve. Said card shall be renewed on or before the first day of May of each year, and the holder of said certificate of registration shall pay to the secretary of said board the sum of \$1 for said renewal card. Upon the failure of any holder of a certificate of registration to apply for renewal of his card on or before the first day of May in each year, his certificate may be revoked by said board, subject to the provision of section 8 of this act."

"Sec. 7. That said board shall keep a register in which shall be entered the names of all persons who receive certificates and permits are issued under this act, and said register shall be open at all times to public inspection."

"Sec. 8. The said board shall have power to revoke any certificate granted under this act that may have been obtained by fraudulent representations or otherwise not strictly in accordance with this act, or upon any of the following grounds: (a) that the holder of the certificate is found to be incompetent; (b) habitual drunkenness for 30 days immediately before a charge duly made; (c) gross incompetency; (d) habitual use of morphine, cocaine or other narcotic drugs; (e) contagious diseases; provided, that before any certificate shall be revoked the holder thereof shall have notice in writing of the charge and charges against him, and shall at a day specified in said notice appear five days after the service thereof, be given a public hearing and full opportunity to confront the witnesses against him. Any person whose certificate has been so revoked may, after the expiration of 90 days, apply to have the same re-granted to him, upon a satisfactory showing."

"Section 9 defines the term 'practicing as a barber.' Section 10 provides that those violating the provisions of the act 'shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not less than \$10 nor more than \$100, or by imprisonment in the County Jail not less than five or more than 30 days, or by both fine and imprisonment.' Section 11 is amended to require barbers, after shaving a customer, to disinfect their instruments, under penalty for neglect to do so. The closing sections are:

"Sec. 12. It shall be unlawful for any person who is not a duly registered barber under this act, to conduct a barber school or give instructions in the art of business, or a barber without the sanction of said board, and if any one shall violate this section, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be punished as provided in section 10 of this act."

"Sec. 13. Inasmuch as the public health is endangered by irregularities in the present law providing for the method of registering barbers and apprentices, and conducting barber shops in this state, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, therefore this act shall take effect and effect forthwith upon its approval by the Governor."

CONFERENCE OPENS TODAY

Scandinavian Lutherans to Transact Business and Discuss Doctrine.

The conference of the Oregon Synod of the Scandinavian Lutheran Evangelical Church will open this morning at 9 o'clock in the church on the southwest corner of East Tenth and Grant streets. Rev. Nels Peterson, of Silverton, president of the conference, will preside during the sessions. The conference is held for general business and discussion of doctrinal points, to which the denomina-

tion holds very strictly. In the afternoon the sessions will last from 2 to 4 o'clock, and will be taken up mainly with discussions and papers on doctrine. One of the principal topics will be "The Blessings of Hearing the Gospel." In the evening the meetings will open at 7:30 o'clock. Next Thursday, Thanksgiving day, special services will be held at 10:30 A. M. Rev. W. Sorenson, of Astoria, will preach. In the afternoon there will be a social gathering of the delegates, who will come from Astoria, Clatsop, Kelso and elsewhere, at the home of Rev. O. Hagroes, who lives in the cottage just back of the church.

DEFENDS PURPLE MOTHER

Theosophist Mrs. Forth as Champion of Mrs. Tingley.

The Indo-American Anti-Child Welfare League had a breezy meeting yesterday afternoon at the home of Mrs. Abigail Scott Duniway, Mrs. Forth, of the Hill in the chair. There was a large attendance, and the discussion took a wide range.

Mrs. E. P. Fraser presented an instructive paper on the Pursees, who are the followers of the Parsi religion, and the descendants of the ancient Persians, who emigrated to India on the conquest of their country by the Arabs, about the year 720 A. D., and now number about 30 per cent of the population of India.

"The men are well formed, intelligent and handsome; the women, small and delicate, with fair complexions and beautiful black eyes, small hands and feet, finely arched eyebrows and abundant black hair. The Parses are the very highest character for honesty, industry and peacefulness, and proverbial for their benevolence and hospitality, and are much more numerous than other Asiatic races. Marriage can only be contracted between persons of the same caste. They call themselves 'those of excellent beliefs,' but others call them worshippers. Their temples contain no idols and nothing they regard as sacred but the fire which is always burning on their altars, which, they say, will be kept burning to the end of the world. They assert that they worship the sun and fire as the highest manifestations of God. But the Parses, despite their intelligence and civilization, are divided in their opinions as to child marriages, one side making strenuous efforts to keep early betrothals and marriages, and the other as strenuously opposing innovations, along with every effort to educate women and admit them to the rights of citizenship."

Mrs. Stone made a brief address, explaining the efficacy of organization as illustrated in the efforts of the New York Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, as exemplified by the Loma incident. An editorial from a late Oregonian on "The Purple Mother" was read, which brought forth a vigorous protest from a visitor, who announced herself as a Theosophist, and proceeded at great length to emphasize her good opinion of Mrs. Tingley and her utter repudiation of the theory that reincarnated souls enter and inhabit animals.

Mrs. Hill, being called away, Mrs. Duniway, first vice president, took the chair. Mrs. Stone made a diplomatic speech, disclaiming any intention of putting Mrs. Tingley on trial. She said she had introduced the Point Loma incident with no other intention than to illustrate the efficacy of organization. This brought the Theosophist to the front again, this time in denunciation of the New York Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children. She said "the Cuban climate of New York without proper food, beds or lodging."

Things were getting hotter when Mrs. Fraser ardently called attention to a newspaper article in direct attack upon Mrs. Tingley's views, and sought her agitation. Mrs. Duniway explained that the objects of the Indo-American League were constructive rather than destructive, being nothing more nor less than a great concerted effort through the organization of women along secular lines, to sustain the Parses, the British government and incidentally the United States in every effort to protect the rights of children all over the world.

Mrs. Kern and Mrs. Dalglish were appointed by the chair to arrange the programme for the next meeting, to be held December 8, at the home of Mrs. Fraser, 330 First street.
