Oregon Players Beaten on Gridiron.

LOCALS WIN BY 16 TO 0

Multnomah Team Crashes Through Sturdy Defense.

GREAT CROWD CHEERS VICTORS

Two Touchdowns Are Made in First Half, and One in Second—Captain Kirkley, of M. A. C., and Kerron, of Oregon, Ruled Off.

"Multnomah outplayed us all the time," said Captain Watts, of the Oregon team, after the game, "and I am confident that it was on this point that she had her greatest advantage. The clubmen put up a great game, and played their hardest to win."

Fighting bravely to the last, stubbornly contesting every inch of ground, but outplayed and outgeneraled, the team of husky football players of the University of Oregon went down to defeat before the eleven from Multnomah Club yesterday afternoon, and the rosters bowed 16 to 0. The day was good for football. The air was crisp and cool, and the assembled multitude on the sidelines and in the grandstand whiled away an ideal Thanksgiving day. The little rain that fell during the second half merely caused the raising of a few umbrellas, which were lowered again when the gentle drizzle stopped. The crowd cheered all the time, and made the most of the game. Half of the 4000 people yelled with shoutful glees when Captain Kirkley's noble form went humping off the field to the side lines for a fumble. The other half returned the compliment when Guard Seth Kerron of the university team went over the same road a moment later. One-half yelled themselves hoarse when Cook punted 45 yards to Oregon's goal line, and the other half the same trick when Payne kicked back on the return. The grandstand was a mass of red and white on one end, with a broad band of lemon yellow chrysanthemums at the other, and it was not hard to tell which side was winning by looking at the color indications.

Crowd in Holiday Array.

The crowd was intensely imbued with the spirit of the day. Every boy on the field had a fag of some sort, or a megaphone, into which he blew with the force of a Boreas blast. Every girl had a ribbon or a flag of the colors of the respective teams, and all the grown-up folks had yellow flowers or scarlet pinks. Poor generalship on the part of the Oregon field captain made the score larger for the Multnomah men than it really should have been. With five and six yards to gain on the third down, instead of vainly endeavoring to make the necessary yardage by bucking the line, the Oregon men should have tackled.

If the ball was thus surrendered, it would be at a point many yards further from the goal than if it had been simply turned over at the spot. Payne should have done the kicking yesterday, for on the exchange of kicks in the second half he was seen to be in good form, and if he had been boosting the leather all the game, he could have made better yardage than Templeton.

It was an off day for Joe Templeton, or he met his match in Floyd Cook, the Multnomah fullback, for when a kicking game was resorted to the University team suffered severely. During the first half, Templeton punted but few times, netting less than 35 yards each time, while Cook would send his kicks high and true, to land on the field for gains of 50 and 15 yards on the average. Towards the end of the play, Templeton picked up wonderfully, and got his punts out for better distance, but at no time during the contest did he make the yardage that Cook did. A grave fault for the University substitutes was the way they stood close up when Cook punted, invariably underestimating the distance of the kick, and thus being forced to run backward to catch the ball. They should have seen early in the game that the proper distance was from 10 to 20 yards further back from where they usually stood.

HOW GAME WAS WON AND LOST.

After two bucks, which netted the "Varsity" boys about three yards, Templeton tried to kick, but made a poor attempt, and the ball rolled out of bounds, making a gain of only 15 yards. The Multnomah players now gathered their forces and commenced to hammer the "Varsity" line for substantial gains. Kerrigan went through left tackle for two yards, Bishop made 1 1/2 yards on a straight buck, and Kerrigan made the required yardage. Stett made 3 1/2 yards on a fake, and Pratt completed the five on a tackle buck. Kirkley tried an end run from tackle position, and made seven yards. Bishop bucked center for 2 1/2 yards, and Kerrigan plunged straight through for 12 yards. Kerrigan and Pratt made substantial gains, and it commenced to look like a touchdown for M. A. C. On the next play, however, Kerrigan's big right guard, broke through the line, spilled the pass, and fell on the ball. It was now dangerously near Oregon's line, and as pointing seemed the surest way of advancing the ball, Templeton booted the ball for 25 yards. Stott tried his quarterback fake, and this time made 4 1/2 yards. Kirkley failed to gain, but Kerrigan, with his famous straight plunge, made the required yardage. Bishop, Kerrigan and Pratt each hit the line for good gains, but on the 10-yard line the "Varsity" took a brace. It looked as if the club was to be held for downs, when Kerrigan again plunged straight through for 2 1/2 yards, landing the ball on the two-yard line. On the next down Bishop plunged through, making the first score for Multnomah, after just 12 minutes of play. McMillan failed to kick the goal. Score, M. A. C., 5; Oregon, 0.

Templeton made a beautiful kick-off, this time, sending the pigskin high in the air and straight down the field to Cook on the 15-yard line. Cook plunged straight ahead and returned it 20 yards. Bishop was downed. Bishop tried left tackle for 4 1/2 yards, but this was too slow for the clubmen and Cook sent the ball whirling 35 yards to Goodrich, who ran it in three yards. Goodrich took the ball through tackle for 3 1/2, and Thayer made the required yardage. The clubmen's defense was too strong, however, and the "Varsity" boys were held for downs. Bishop kicked left for five yards, and Cook punted 20 yards. A punting game looked good to Templeton, and he sent it back for 30 yards, where it was caught by Stott and advanced 35 yards. Bishop again made good gains, and Pratt skirted left end for 10 yards. The "Varsity" again took a brace and held the clubmen for downs. Templeton punted on the first down, netting the Multnomah 20 yards. Bishop and Kerrigan made 10 yards each, and Stott's quarterback fake was resorted to, but this time to no avail.
