appointed a receiver for the Otter Creel United States Consul Dudley, at Vancouver, Coal & Lumber Company, of Tucker County, West Virginia. Over \$500,000 is B. C., reports to the State Department as folinvolved.

In advance sheets of Consular Reports, No. 1470, issued October 16, 1992, a report of mine was published regarding the lumber industry in British Columbia, in which I made the statement that an export duty had been placed upon timber cut upon the public lands of this province. The information upon which I made that statement was derived from the newspa-pers of this city, but my attention has since been called to the fact that it is not an export duty, but an absolute prohibition placed by the government upon the export of timber cut upon lands owned by the province. Timber off all unsurveyed and unpre-empted crown lands can be cut either under Si-prear beases or annual licenses. During the session of 1901, an amendment to the them existing land act was passed, reading as follows: "All timber cut from provincial lands must be manufactured within the confines of the province of British Columbia, "otherwise the timber so cut may be selised and forfeited to the coven and the lense canceled."
