AMOUNT PLACED AT \$760,000

Apparent Valuation of Property Will Reach \$150,000,000—Revenue Needed is \$100,000 Less Than Last Year.

SALEM, Or., Jan. 2.—(Special.)—Governor Geat, Secretary of State Dunbar and State Treasurer Moore today made the official estimate of the expenses of the state for the year 1903, placing the amount at \$760,000. No state tax levy will be made this year, as the state taxes are apportioned among the several counties at a ratio fixed by law.

The average amount of revenue per year for the last 15 years has been \$556,000, so that it will be seen that the advance is about in line with the development of the state and the increased needs of the state institutions.
