Lewis and Clark Centennial University Park

On Monday, Jan. 5, 1903, this company had a river steamer to make four trial trips from Hermit Vale (formerly Lover's Lane), University Park, to the Centennial Exposition site. The result showed that the river could be easily made in seven and one-half minutes, consequently a boat will be leased or built to ply between those points during the Exposition. It will require not to exceed one-fourth the time to make the trip between University Park and the Exposition grounds that it will require to go from the Exposition grounds to the Postoffice. Many persons are now buying lots at University Park for camping purposes during the Exposition. The liquor restriction that has been placed in all deeds executed by the owners of University Park property ever since the first platting of this suburb, 12 years ago, will make it a desirable place for campers and roomers, as the peace of the place will not be disturbed by drunks and bums.
