MANNER OF PRO-RATING.

Connecticut Court Defines Matter for Fire Insurance Companies.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Jan. 13.-The Supreme Judicial Court has sent down an important decision defining the manner in which fire insurance companies should pro-rated when the insurance is covbe pro-rated when the insurance is cov-ered partly by blanket and partly by spe-cific policies and the loss is partial. The decision covers a point not bitherto de-termined, and is of unusual interest to lawyers and insurance men. The decision is made in the case of Adam

The decision is made in the case of Adam Schamelzie vs. the Lancashire and 33 other insurance companies. Schamelzie is a technical plaintiff. His brewery was burned down. It was insured by these 34 companies for \$60,000. Thirty-one companies had blanket policies and three had specific policies, the latter amounting to \$5000. The total loss was about \$42,000.
