

BETWEEN TWO FIRES

Congress Is Worried About the Trust Question.

PRESIDENT DEMANDS ACTION

Trust Magnates Press for Inaction or for a Mild and Harmless Bill—Senators Angry Because Roosevelt Keeps Their Irons Hot.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 14.—There is evidence that the Republican majority is very greatly disturbed over the subject of trusts, and scarcely knows which way to turn. The President is pressing the matter very hard. Corporations and capitalists are bringing all the pressure possible to bear to prevent any legislation, or at least to make any bill which may be selected of such a mild character that it will not be effective.

DOLLIVER CALLED DOWN.

Republican Managers Object to His Exploiting Iowa Idea. OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 14.—Senator Dolliver, of Iowa, was given to understand today that the position he took yesterday is far from satisfactory to the Republican managers, and he feels like a man who has been disciplined to a certain extent for speaking over the traces. He has said to a few friends privately that any man who departs from the lines laid down by the majority with regard to the tariff is subject to the charge that he is not faithful to the tenets of the Republican party.

NEW SENATORS TO COME IN.

Those Elected or Who Are Sure of Election. OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 14.—The terms of 20 Senators will expire on March 3. Of this number several have been re-elected, while others have been renominated by the state primaries and by the caucuses of the Legislatures.

CANNOT FIND PRECEDENT.

Newspaper Story About Interference in Senatorial Fight Baseless. OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 14.—It has been stated in several Eastern papers that President Roosevelt had precedent for his alleged interference in the Utah Senatorial contest in that President Cleveland had, in 1894, interfered and prevented the election of Moses Thatcher, who is a Mormon apostle, like Smoot. Senator Dubois today telegraphed to Cleveland and to Thatcher.

TO SELL FORT HALL LANDS.

Bill Reported to House, but Price Is Doubled. OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 14.—The House public lands committee today favorably reported the Senate bill providing for the disposal of the meadow lands on the old Fort Hall reservation lying within the five-mile limit of Pocatello.

Lyons for Attorney in Alaska.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 14.—G. B. Estery and Thomas J. Fogarty, of Yakima, Alaska, had an interview with the President today to urge the appointment of Thomas R. Lyons as United States Attorney for the First District of Alaska, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Robert A. Friedrich. Lyons is now assistant attorney at Juneau.

Pension for Indian War Veterans.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 14.—A pension was granted today to ex-Senator Lafayette Grove, of Portland, under the Indian War veteran act of last session.

PRESIDENT APPROVES BILL.

House Committee Shows It and Will Report Next Week. WASHINGTON, Jan. 14.—Representative Littlefield of Maine, Overstreet of Indiana and Powers of Massachusetts, Republican members of the subcommittee of the House Judiciary committee, had a conference with the President today, at which there was a free exchange of views on the subject of an anti-trust bill. It is said that the Administration and the committee members are in harmony so far as policy is concerned, and that the only points of difference relate to matters of detail.

HELP COMES TO SULTAN.

Rebellious Tribes Join Him in Fight Against Pretender. TANGIER, Morocco, Jan. 14.—The latest news received here from Fez is that large reinforcements have joined the Sultan. The rebels, who were recently in rebellion, and the arrival of these reinforcements has put the Sultan in a position to expect the success of his expedition.

FRANCE WILL SEND TROOPS.

Orders Foreign Legion to Prepare for March on Morocco. PARIS, Jan. 14.—A dispatch received here from Tangier, Morocco, under today's date says a courier who arrived there from Fez brought reassuring intelligence. Nothing is known at Tangier of the reported defeat of the Sultan or of his rumored retreat westward.

Consuls Are Leaving Fez.

LONDON, Jan. 14.—The foreign consuls have either left Fez or will do so immediately, says the Times' Tangier correspondent.

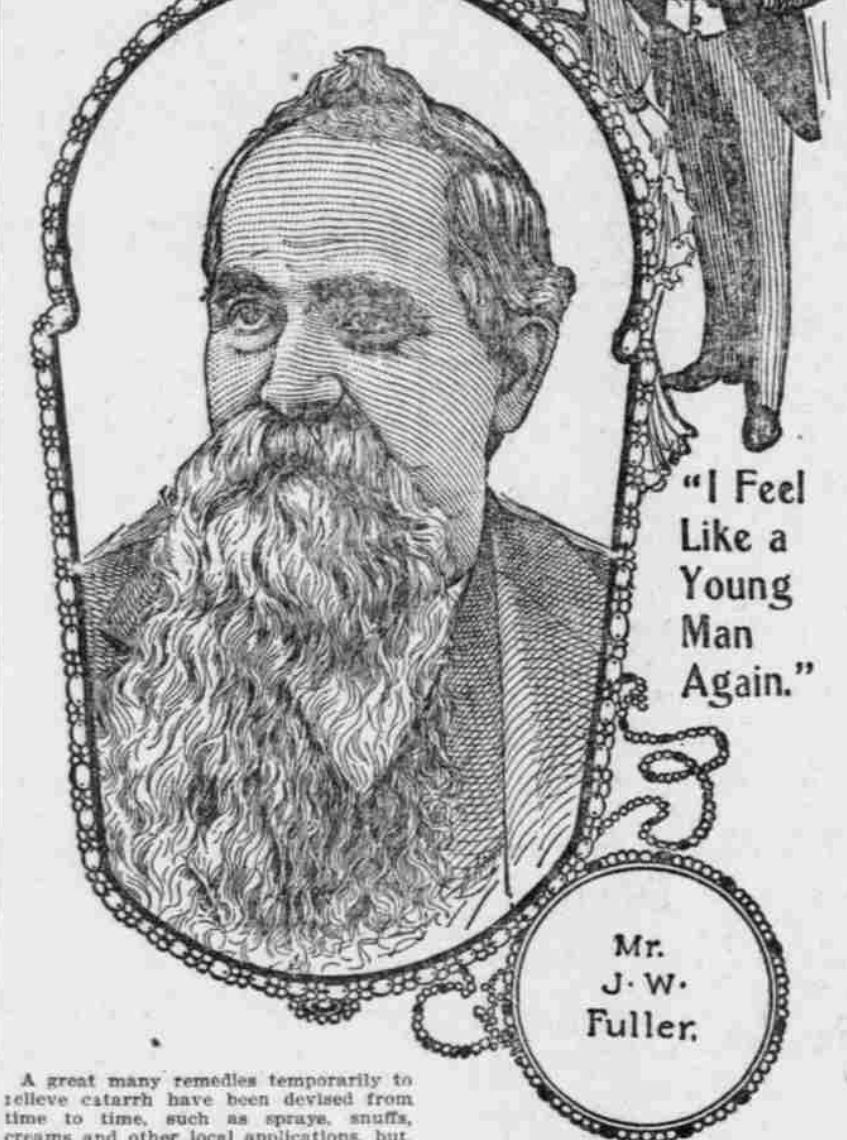
Corbett Challenges Jeffries.

Impetuous Castro Raising Money by Means of Forced Loan. WILLEMSTAD, Island of Curacao, Jan. 14.—It has been learned here that the Venezuelan government has ordered a forced loan of \$2,400,000, being one-quarter of the total loan contemplated. The loan is obligatory on all Venezuelan merchants, traders and bankers.

CASTRO OFFERS TO PAY.

On Condition Blockade Is Raised—Britain and Germany to Decide. ROME, Jan. 14.—It is officially learned here that President Castro has informed the powers that he is disposed to pay the expenses of maintaining the blockading squadron in Venezuelan waters on condition that the blockades be raised immediately, and it is also absolutely decided that Italy would be inclined to accept this proposal, even if it were made.

BOWEN HAS FULL POWER.

Arrives at Kingston, Jamaica, on Way to Washington. KINGSTON, Jamaica, Jan. 14.—The United States dispatch boat Dolphin, with Minister Bowen on board, called here today for coal. Mr. Bowen paid a visit to the Governor's residence. The Minister says he has full powers as the representative of Venezuela at the coming conference at Washington, and has strong hopes that the powers of Venezuela will reach a settlement without referring the questions in dispute to the Hague court of arbitration.

\$150,000 Blaze at Cleveland.

CLEVELAND, Jan. 14.—Fire tonight in Brown Bros' house furnishing store on Ontario street, did damage estimated at \$150,000. The adjoining store of Nathan & Skov, carrying the same line of goods, was damaged \$20,000.

LA PAZ, Bolivia, Dec. 13.—News was received here December 13 from Santa Cruz, the capital of the Republic of Santa Cruz, Eastern Bolivia, that Nicholas Suarez, the sub-Commissioner of the Territory of Madre de Dios, had at the head of a Bolivian volunteer force, raised and captained by himself, gained a decisive victory October 11 over the revolutionists at a point called Bahia.
