Multnomah Delegation Urges Immediate Action.

WANT IT INCLUDED IN LEVY

Prompt Passage of Library Tax Bill Also to Be Asked—Multnomah Legislators Meet for Conference Monday Night.

SALEM, Or., Jan. 22.—Staff Correspondence.—The Multnomah delegation will urge that the fireboat tax for Portland and the library tax for Multnomah be enacted at once. Early action is necessary, especially on the fireboat bill, in order that the item may be included in the Multnomah levy the first of next month. If action is not taken there will be six days next week to pass the bills and to have them signed by the Governor. The fireboat bill calls for a levy of 15 mills, to be collected this year, and the library bill for 15 mills. The library bill will be devoted to the Portland library, which already is provided for in the new city charter by a levy of 15 mills. Not enough money, however, is available from this source. Under the two levies, therefore, the City of Portland will be paying 30 mills and Multnomah County outside of Portland 15 mills. This bill was withdrawn today from the House, although it had been made a matter of special business for 10 A. M. The reason was that it was a bill for raising revenue, and had been introduced first in the Senate by Senator Sweeney. It will be introduced Friday morning in the House as a new bill.

The Multnomah delegation will meet next Monday night. At that time the fireboat bill will be considered and on Tuesday the delegation in the House will recommend passage of the measure. The bill has been read twice in the House and is now in the hands of the Multnomah delegation for report.

Under the terms of the law, citizens of Multnomah County outside of Portland will enjoy the same privileges in the library as do citizens of Portland.

Several bills that were to come up for third reading today were referred back to committees on account of the fact that the measures were not headed by an enacting clause. This enacting clause requirement is causing some delay in legislation. All measures are now headed by "Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon," and "Be it enacted by the People of the State of Oregon."

The House this morning adopted the Senate joint memorial of Senator Mays, calling upon Congress to construct canal locks above The Dalles. The House adopted a Senate memorial relative to a constitutional amendment so that the office of the State Printer may be subject to the control of the Legislature. The bill empowers the Legislature to fix the term of office and the salary of the State Printer.

A. C. Jennings, Chief Clerk of the House, has held that position for four consecutive sessions. This is the first time he has been Clerk of the House. He has been a member of the House twice from Lane County.

A bill to provide for the disposition of personal property found on body upon which an inquest has been held will be introduced by Representative Maloney. The measure provides that the Coroner shall deliver such property to the persons who are entitled to possession. The Coroner is authorized to use toward defraying the funeral expenses of the body what money he may find upon the body, and to sell other property for the same purpose. Any excess after these expenses have been met is to be deposited with the County Treasurer. All the property thus deposited is to be subject to the orders of the legal representatives of the deceased, if claimed within five years. If not so claimed the property is to vest in the county. In Multnomah County the Coroner is to appoint one deputy, whose bond is to be \$500. In case of sudden death any person present at the time of the demise is to be required to look into the causes of the death, to prepare the body for burial, and before in any way molesting the body, they are to notify the Coroner.

The special committee from the Twenty-first and Twenty-eighth Representative districts, to which was referred the Burgess bill to create the County of Stockton, today made a favorable report.

A petition was presented in the House today by Blythe from citizens of Linn County, praying for the creation of Linn County. The petition is signed by a list of signatures that stretches out several yards. It states that deer in Linn County are approaching extermination. "As the law stands all persons are prohibited from killing deer from July 15 to November 1, and does from August 1 to November 1." The petition prays for an open season between March 1 and October 1.

E. D. Reaser, President of the State Normal School at Monmouth, is attending the Legislature in the interest of his institution. The school will ask for an increased appropriation. It now receives \$25,000 biennially. President Reaser says that the institution needs about \$500 more than that sum for the next two years.
